Close Up Information

Washington DC... HERE WE COME!!

Our Close Up students and chaperones have worked extremely hard this year to make this educational adventure a reality!! Our journey began in the spring of last school year with choosing the dates and securing the advisors who would lead the crew.

At the beginning of the school year we advertised that any 11th or 12th grade student could participate; the student had to complete a questionnaire and write an essay on why they want to participate in Close Up and why he/she should be chosen. Once the students were chosen, In order to secure their spot for the program each student was required to pay a \$200 deposit out of pocket with the understanding that they would get their deposit back for the trip if we were able to raise enough money to attend. In addition each student had to agree to participate in all fundraising efforts, maintain their eligibility, have zero behavior referrals and have good attendance.

We are excited to share that our students have exceeded those expectations and have shown their commitment to make this trip a reality; We have raised enough money to participate in the weeklong program and each student will receive their deposit back to use as spending money while we are in Washington DC. Our fundraising activities included 50/50, raffle, concessions, wreath sales, candy gram sales, pop shoot, popcorn sales, Native American Classic shirts, bake sales at local bazaars and a Go Fund Me. We received donations from the Whitefish Credit Union, Manpower, JOM, and Glacier Electric. In total we raised \$32,463.

The cost of the trip, including returning student deposits is \$32,241.

Close Up will depart from GreatFalls on Sunday May 5, 2024 at 5:45am and return to GreatFalls Friday May 10, 2024 at 11:30pm. We are looking forward to a week long educational experience that we can't wait to share with you all.
