The North Bend High School Bridges program is designed to meet the needs of today's learner. A space where every student is welcomed and every student belongs. A program that meets students where they are, develops a plan for the future, and relentlessly pursues the goal of graduation and preparation for the next step in life. Bridges students will eventually choose a job pathway(s) that will result in integrated instruction, connected experiences, internships, and job placements.

Goals

- **#1** Each year students, with family and teachers, will collaboratively develop & review personal education goals using student data.
- **#2** Provide multiple options for high school completion, that meet the varying needs of all stake holders, centered around student engagement and real-world application.
- **#3** Become a premier program in Coos County, through partnerships, CTE pathways and "blended delivery" methods, to ensure transition from students to positively contributing members of society.

NB Bridges Students can take advantage of the following:

<u>Completion options</u> – The State allows multiple ways for students to complete high school requirements. NB Bridges will support students through the use of the State Diploma,

Modified Diploma &/or GED requirements. In the near future, industrial certifications will also be available.

<u>Small Class Sizes</u> – Our goal is to offer small class sizes with a student/teacher ratio of 15:1 that gives more time for constructive feedback, making positive connections and individualized planning for their future.

<u>Credit Recovery</u> – Individual student academic data will be reviewed, by the student and staff, to design a proficiency plan focused on the student's missing standards.

<u>Accelerated Credit Awarding</u> – The North Bend Bridges schedule divides the trimester into two six-week blocks. Courses will be designed around power standards with a set of various assessments, lessons and projects to show proficiency. Students can work on multiple sections at a time and move on to the next block mid-term in accordance with their individual plan.

<u>Flexible Scheduling</u>—Students, with input from families, will be involved in making their own schedule. All Day Bridges Schedule, Half Bridges/Half NBHS Schedule, Half Bridges/Half Off Campus (Work Experience/Credit Recovery) Schedule, or All Day at Home Schedule.

How does the schedule facilitate accelerated credits

A full time NB Bridges student has the opportunity to earn at least nine (9) credits in a single trimester. Due to the 9:00am start, a student can enroll in a NBHS 1st period class, along with the four blocks of course sections taught by Bridges Staff. With the addition of Independent Studies Classes, Credit Recovery classes, Work Experiences and Electives, a student can earn even more than the base nine credits.
