The SEL Team will be utilizing the Conscious Discipline Feeling Buddies Curriculum and it will be delivered to students through virtual small group instruction.



Positives:

KW/Vina Elementary held our first MTSS meetings the week of November 30th! It was the first sense of normalcy for our campus in this CRAZY year. We now have students placed in small groups for additional instruction that are designed for each student's unique learning needs for ELA and social-emotional learning. Teachers begin virtual small group instruction the week of December 7th.

Challenges:

A challenge this fall was conducting Remote Aimsweb Benchmarking Assessment for students in K & 1. We were fortunate in September to have PreK students in the building to complete their fall assessment work through our Child Find Event. However, K and 1 teachers conducted their ELA and mathematics assessments with students via Google Meet. Teachers quickly became proficient at using Google Meet presentation mode, digital record keeping, creating Keynote presentations, and providing tech support to families. Although it was a challenge, teachers worked through the months of October and November to complete as many student assessments as possible while being flexible to parent/guardian work schedules and mindful of each student's ability to maintain attention to a task.

Connection & Engagement (daily attendance during remote


learning) is now being taken during our daily morning meetings, SeeSaw platform engagement/assignment submissions, continued weekly phone contacts to families, and small group instruction.


Graduation Matters

The Aimsweb testing window closed on November 30th. As of that date, we had assessed 79 students with the Early Literacy measure in a remote environment. (59% of our total K enrollment).



We had assessed 88 students with the Aimsweb Early Numeracy measure, also in a remote environment. (66% of our total K enrollment).




In a typical school year, after gathering Fall benchmark data, our next step is to hold MTSS meetings to discuss, sort, and plan for students in ways that meet both their academic and social emotional needs.

In the first week of December we held the Kindergarten MTSS meetings virtually. We may have had to adjust our processes to function in a remote environment, but we were still able to analyze data, sort our focus folders, and plan targeted groups to meet students' needs. We also converted both PDSAs and Small Group instruction into digital processes that can be done remotely. Each Kindergarten teacher will be teaching 3 small groups of their homeroom students via Google Meet (synchronous learning). The first cycle of Small Groups begins December 8th.

Many things to be thankful for in November. The biggest highlight being that we are finally able to regularly interact with our first graders. Using Seesaw (asynchronous learning), we are able to see and hear our students reading, writing, completing math, and the rest of their work, and best of all, smiling. As activities come in every day, teachers have been working on giving meaningful feedback to their students on their work. Our team has also started holding daily morning meetings with their students to build a sense of classroom community, communicate daily expectations, and lead a Brain Smart Start (Conscious Discipline) with their students. In a Brain Smart Start, teachers lead an activity to unite (movement, singing), an activity to connect (Wish you well routine), an activity to disengage stress (deep breathing), and an activity to commit (committing to following an expectation). Teachers are also consistently using visual schedules to help students track their progress through activities and morning meetings. These strategies are all part of our Tier 1 SEL/B support for all students at KW/Vina, and this time has really helped teachers understand how important and impactful these strategies are. When we return to the classrooms, I expect to see more teachers using these strategies consistently and with purpose, and that is a very exciting prospect. Our team has been incredibly flexible and adaptable, and with small group instruction on the horizon, I have no doubt they will rise to the challenge.





Culture Matters (School Climate)

The Kindergarten Immersion our class has been engaging with Morning meets, having 80% of attendance during meets. Although we are learning virtually the students are staying committed and are working hard by adapting to the new learning norms. During our morning meets, we are learning about the power of prayer by smudging. Every morning when it's time to smudge, each student has a beaming smile. Our class is learning how to smudge during these meetings, and can't wait to get a smudge kit (currently working to make this happen). We are currently working on; identifying animals and mastering numbers 1-10 in Blackfeet. With Christmas approaching fast, the Kindergarten Immersion class will be learning to sing a Christmas song in our Blackfeet language.

In Kindergarten BNAS for the Months of October and November 2020 we have switched from packets to the learning platform Seesaw. It has been challenging and we have adapted to online learning. We have been learning to count, our kinship terms, and we are learning about smudging. I am also with Mrs. Shooter in the mornings during her morning meet with her students. We are working on getting the students a smudge kits. The students enjoy getting on the google meet and interacting with each other online. I do a short lesson with the Immersion students before we end our google meet. This has been working out well for us and more students have been logging on as the days go by.

At Vina Chattin, we began with identifying animals by their colors. We've moved on to "Powwow Sweat" which is on YouTube. It's a step by step "how to dance". I also explained different dances, and parts of the powwow. At the end of November would have been our mini powwow before the Thanksgiving break. So the expectation for the kids was to dance, practice, and get sweated up. The next video is about "social dances", I taught the Round dance, Owl Dance, and Rabbit Dance - students are to practice or teach someone in their household. This will be my most recent video which will be teaching and practicing our Christmas songs in the Blackfoot language before Christmas and the New Year!

We'll see what the new year brings us as far as lesson plans.


Wow--November seemed to fly by so quickly. We were so excited to distribute the new ipads to our students and get started with online video learning. We had 100% pickup on day 1 so the parents/students were excited too. PreK teachers have been posting videos every week on Seesaw. The response has been great! We have almost 100% participation



which includes responding to the videos with either a snapshot of their work, a video response or a drawing.

We are working diligently to connect with the few kids that are not active yet. We are getting close to 100% participation which is exciting. We are making phone calls and emailing parents as necessary to reach that goal. We also started daily Google Meets with our students. Oh the joy of finally getting to connect and talk to them is indescribable. We spend about 30 minutes each morning to check in with them and set the learning tone for the day. This is much like our Circle Time that we have when we are in school. We use Conscious Discipline techniques to unite, connect, disengage stress and commit to a learning expectation. We also say the BEAR cheer, look at the learning schedule for the day, mark the day of the week and sing a song or two. The students also get a chance to respond verbally to the teacher and others in their class. It is fun and engaging. This month we started our unit on "Community"--What is a community? Our students are learning about community helpers and how they can be "kind helpers". They even got to go on a virtual field trip to the Browning Fire Hall. They got to learn about the special equipment that firemen use and wear and see the fire truck. We will continue this unit in January.

We had a great Thanksgiving week with special lessons created by the PreK teachers. Our students really seemed to enjoy our activities. We are planning another "holiday celebration week" for Christmas. Yikes--can you believe it is almost Christmas?
