The meeting was called to order at 12:00 p.m. Wednesday, May 14, 2025 by Committee Chair Renee Anderson.

• CALL TO ORDER

- 1. IIA-Instructional Materials Policy
 - Heather Severns explained that the updated policy from OSBA was adopted in full due to the extensive number of edits needed for the MESD version.
 - Helen Ying noted the improved inclusiveness of the OSBA language compared to the previous MESD policy.
 - The committee agreed to move this rewritten policy to the Action Agenda.

2. IKF-Graduation Requirements Policy

- This policy was also rewritten using required OSBA legal language to reflect statutory updates.
- It now includes updated terminology such as the "Certificate of Attendance" replacing previous alternative certificate language.
- Committee agreed to keep optional explanatory language for clarity and move this policy to the Action Agenda.

- 3. Board Policy Summaries Project
 - Heather shared the status of the multilingual policy summaries now available on the MESD website.
 - Summaries are being translated into five languages and housed on the MESD Board Policies page.
 - The site is still under development and may be temporarily unpublished for continued updates.
- 4. Gender Identity and Policy Audit
 - Sascha Perrins reviewed nine policies for gender-related language in alignment with the board's recent resolution.
 - Several policies already include references to sexual orientation and gender identity; some require minor updates.
 - Specifically, Policy #8 (Student Records) lacks language affirming the right to privacy regarding gender identity. Sascha will return with draft language to address this.
 - Policies IGBAB/JO, JF/JFA, and KAB will be reviewed and brought to the June Policy Committee meeting with updated language.
 - Discussion noted that Oregon law permits the withholding of such information from parents in certain cases.
- 5. Data Privacy & Technology
 - Concerns were raised about student data privacy, especially in relation to third-party services and AI systems.
 - The group discussed how sensitive data should be handled and protected, particularly in light of digitization efforts.
- 6. Future Review
 - Policies flagged for further review in June: IGBAB/JO, JF/JFA and KAB.
 - The committee acknowledged that while progress has been made, nuanced work remains regarding gender identity protections in policies.

Additional Updates

- Two scholarship recipients have confirmed attendance at the upcoming board meeting. Twelve were invited in total.
- Committee members expressed appreciation for Heather's ongoing work and thorough policy reviews.
