

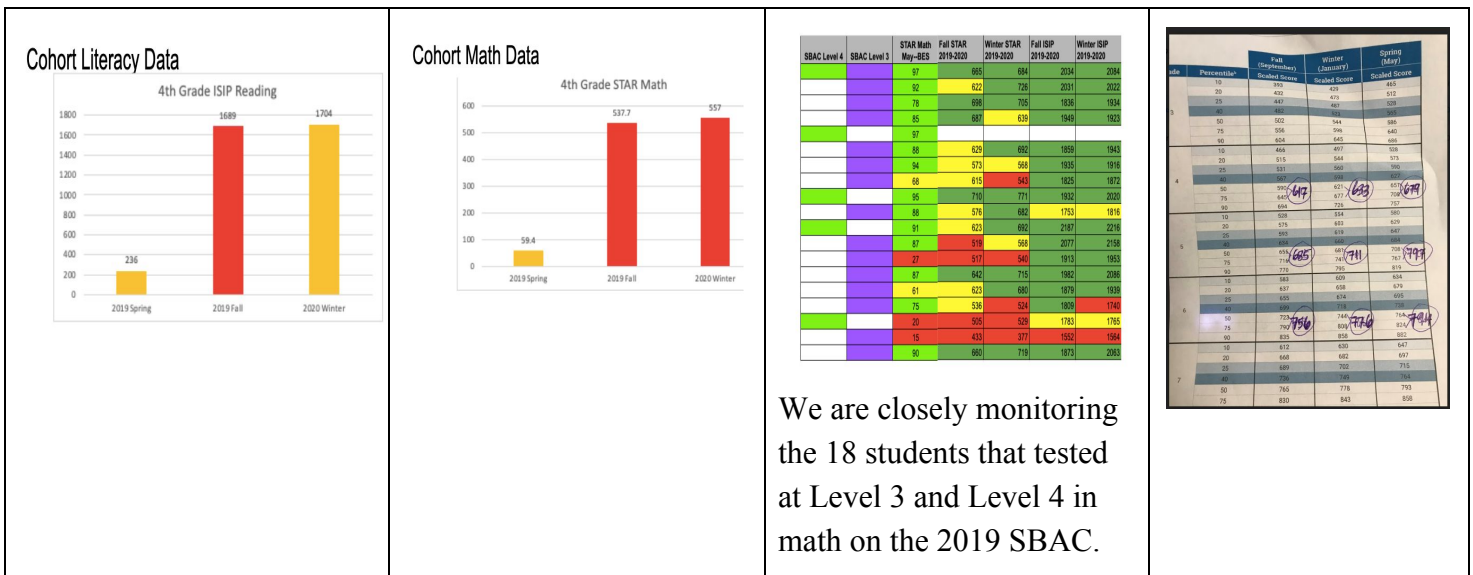
Napi Elementary Board Report

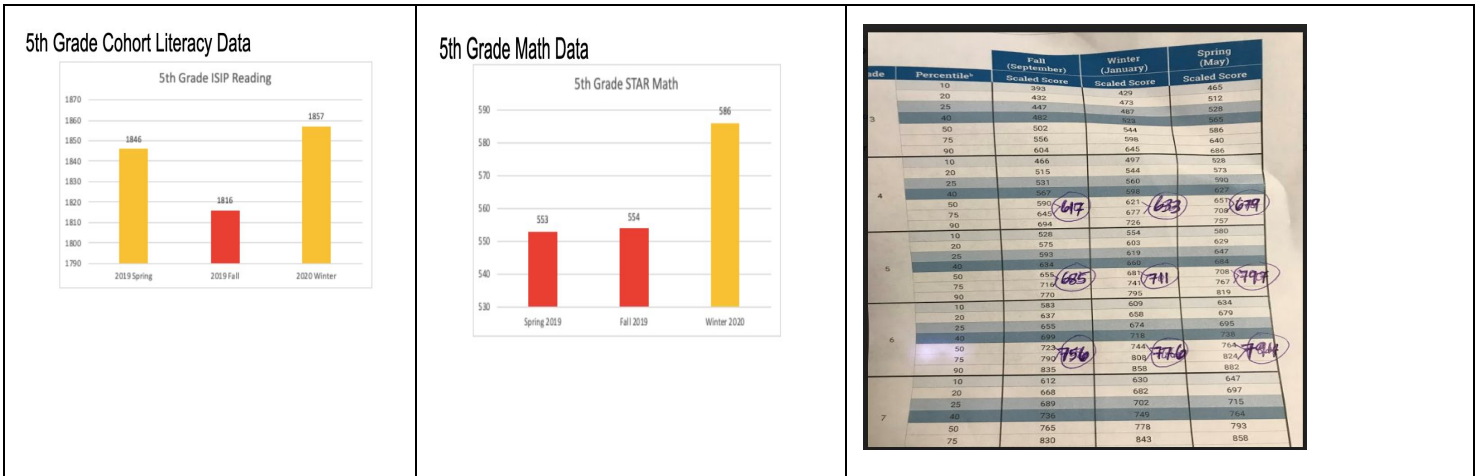
The following data and writing samples were part of the presentation that we omitted due to time. As promised, the data was included in this month's board report.

This data shows a cohort of the same students from 3rd grade (spring '19 to winter '20), that compares data "apples to apples". In mathematics, (STAR Math) when comparing the fall '19 4th grade students, who are tested prior to any formal instruction, they come to Napi with an average scaled score of 537 in the fall. This equates to a 3rd grade level. By the winter benchmark, the same students are averaging a scaled score of 557. This equates to a fourth grade level around the 25th percentile. The norm is the 40th percentile on a national basis, while the District reports at the 70th percentile.

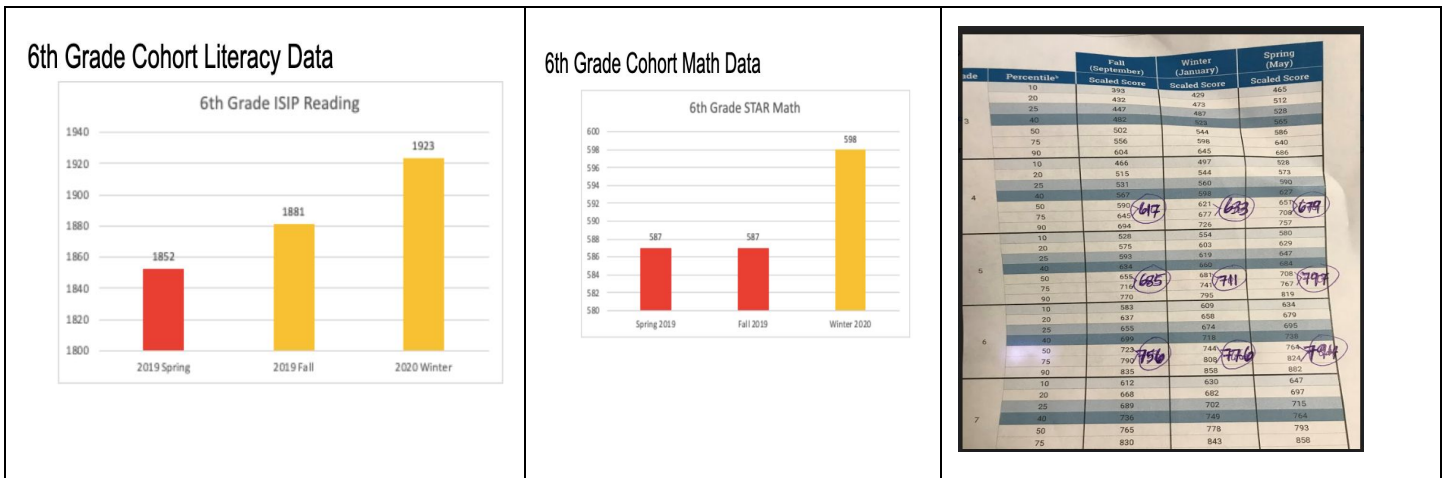


With our current 5th grade students, they left 4th grade with an average scaled score of 533. The tested in the fall, prior to any formal instruction with an average scaled score of 534. This places the students at

the 10th percentile ranking as 5th graders. The winter benchmark shows growth with an average scaled score of 586, which places students in the 5th grade at the 25th percentile.



The 6th grade left 5th grade with an average scaled score of 587, or at the 10th percentile. By winter benchmark, our 6th graders have an average scaled score of 598, or at the 20th percentile.



February was a busy month for the instructional coaches. Besides daily walkthroughs, we continued with coaching cycles. Mrs. Bragg has two active coaching cycles while Mrs. Wagner is working with three. The coaches are continuing with monthly coaches training provided by our consultant, Debbie Hunsaker. We've provided team level coaching sessions along with assisting in the planning and delivering of professional development for Wednesday extended days.

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Counselors:

The counseling center was busy during the month of February. Both counselors taught the Second Step Curriculum daily to all students in grades 4 and 5. Daily lessons revolved around skill building in handling strong emotions. The Spokinnapi Program also taught all students in grades 4-5 an alcohol awareness curriculum that they are in the process of developing. Counselors have been sending meals home with approximately 75 students every weekend that are in the backpack program in need of support. Additionally, counselors have been providing Tier I support to all students in grades 4-6.
