GOAL 1: THE DISTRICT WILL STRIVE TO PROVIDE THE BEST EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS.

Safe Learning Plan updates – The students and staff at the Elementary and Intermediate Schools welcomed the recent adjustments to the district Safe Learning Plan. The shift to recommended but not required masking took place on Feb. 22 inside the buildings and on buses by Feb 28. Students and staff are maintaining most entrance and exit routines but are able to shift from social distancing protocols within the classroom spaces.

Early Childhood Screening days completed – Our preschool staff assisted with the final scheduled screening day on Feb. 14. Any remaining screenings will be conducted on an appointment basis.

Book Fair book credit

A fun part of the spring conferences returned this year with great success. The book fair was available at the elementary media center during the two conference nights. While students and parents can pick up copies of their favorite books, our schools benefit from an incentive program. We receive book credits for every book sold and our schools accumulated \$2800 in credit. These books will replenish the paperback supply in our elementary and intermediate school libraries.

History Day

Sixth grade students at the Intermediate School have been working their way through the History Day process throughout February and March. The 2022 theme is "Debate and Diplomacy: Successes, Failures, Consequences". Students will present their projects locally in mid March with chosen projects moving on to a virtual regional contest and possible state contest in late March.
