The No Child Left Behind Act Title I, Part A – Improving Basic Programs Operated by Local Education Agencies Schoolwide Programs

- A. **Purpose of the Program:** The purpose of Title I, Part A funds in a schoolwide program is, in combination with other federal, state, and local funds, to improve student performance by upgrading the entire educational program in a school. All campuses in BISD are schoolwide programs. To qualify as a schoolwide program a minimum of 40% of the student population must be categorized as economically disadvantaged. Private schools are invited to receive services funded by Title I, Part A. In addition, it is required that five percent of the district's entitlement by allocated for staff development for the development of a highly qualified staff.
- B. **Description of the Program:** The Title I, Part A program for BISD promotes a focus on instructional strategies and student success, provides flexibility to campus initiatives, and promotes collaboration among the school, parents, and community. Title I, Part A funds support the district's efforts to improve student achievement by providing funds for reading intervention teachers, CCC labs, teaching assistants, and library assistants.

Title I, Part A funds are also allocated for Parent Volunteer Coordinators at each regular campus, Practical Parent Education training, and the PEP program.

The No Child Left Behind Act Title II, Part A – Teacher and Principal Training and Recruitment Fund

- A. **Purpose of the Program:** The purpose of Title II, Part A programming is to fund, based on needs, activities related to one or more of the following: recruiting, hiring, and retention of highly qualified personnel; providing professional development; improving the quality of the teacher workforce; or reducing class size. Private schools are invited to participate in services related to staff development. (Title II funds were previously designated for math and science improvement and staff development activities. Class size reduction funds were under Title VI.)
- B. **Description of the Program:** BISD has allocated the majority of Title II, Part A funds for the reduction of class size. Class size reduction funds have allowed the district to maintain positions that would have been cut due to the loss of student enrollment.

The No Child Left Behind Act Title II, Part D – Enhancing Education through Technology

- A. **Purpose of the Program:** Title II, Part D funds are funds allocated to districts through the No Child Left Behind Act. These funds are to be used to improve student achievement of all students, including technology literacy of all students and to improve the capacity of all teachers teaching in schools served by the district to integrate technology effectively into curricula and instruction. A minimum of 25 percent of these funds must be allocated to staff development activities.
- B. **Description of the Program:** These funds will be used to help support the district's technology initiative. Staff will have the opportunity to participate in training opportunities for improving technology skills and integrating technology effectively into curricula. It is required that the district have a policy of internet safety for minors in place.

No Child Left Behind Act Title IV, Part A – Safe and Drug Free Schools and Communities

- A. **Purpose of Program:** Title IV funds are designated for local districts to develop, implement, and evaluate comprehensive programs and activities to foster a safe and drug-free learning environment that supports academic achievement. Such programming should be designed to prevent or reduce violence; the use, possession and distribution of illegal drugs; and delinquency. Funds are to be used to create a well disciplined environment and promote parental involvement.
- B: **Description of Program:** BISD addresses drug awareness education and violence prevention in the classroom by utilizing nurses who work closely with school staff, students, and community members in promoting healthy lifestyles. The district also offers teen leadership classes at the high school and junior high. SDSFC funding has provided for ongoing training through the M. B. Flippen corporation (Teen Leadership and Capturing Kids Hearts), and provides for outside speakers. Private schools are invited to participate in Title IV services.
