Practice the "5 R's" of early education: reading, rhyming, routines, rewards and relationships. Researchers have hard evidence that reading to children activates the parts of preschoolers' brains that help with mental imagery and understanding narrative — both of which are key for the development of language and literacy. The American Academy of Pediatrics say that parents who spend time reading to their children create nurturing relationships, which is important for a child's cognitive, language and social-emotional development.

Health Room Hints

Because We Care...

- ♥ Appearance/Behavior: Unusually tired, pale, lack of appetite, difficult to wake, confused or irritable.
- ♥ Eyes: Thick mucus or pus draining from the eye or pink eye.
- ♥ Fever: A temperature of 100 degrees or higher. Please keep your child home for 24 hours after fever is absent without fever reducing medicine.
- Nose drainage or chronic cough: Especially if associated with a fever.
- Sore throat: Especially if associated with a fever and/or swollen glands.
- ♥ Diarrhea: 2 or more episodes in a 24 hr. period especially if the child looks or acts ill.
- ♥ Vomiting: Vomiting 2 or more times within the last 24 hours.
- **Rash:** especially if associated with a fever or if located on the hands, feet, and mouth area.
- ♥Lice: Children will be checked if there is a suspected infestation and parents will be notified of positive results. Please notify the school if you find head lice on your child.
- Attendance is important, however, If your child has any of the above symptoms, it may be necessary to pick him or her up from school – Please update the office if your contact information changes.
