

Community Education Funding

Only 14% of the Community Education 2.8 million in expenditures are covered by levies and aid (\$400,749)



Where does the rest of our funding come from to run our Department?

- Fees for Childcare/Preschool
- Fees for Classes and Events

Levies and Aid includes:

- Community Education General Levy receives \$5.32 for every resident within the school district and will increase to \$6.35 in FY 25.
- Other levies include ECFE, School Readiness, Homevisiting, Early Childhood, Parent Aware, Parent Aware Pathway I & II and VPK funding, Special Needs Levy, Adult with Disabilities, Youth Enrichment.

Community Needs Assessment - March 2024

Why We Conducted a Survey

- Our Community Education Advisory Council asked us to conduct a needs assessment.
- No existing templates or models so we had to create our own.
- We wanted to get a bigger picture of performance of programs.
- We wanted to get ideas from our stakeholders (including students) about implementing our strategic plan (we want to be active and participatory).



Survey Objectives

Assess Community Needs & Interests: Understand the needs and interests of community members, including topics they are interested in, as well as strategic plan areas.

Evaluate Current Programs: Gather feedback on existing programs or services offered to assess their effectiveness and identify areas for improvement.

Identify Barriers to Participation:
Determine barriers that community members face in accessing community education programming, including fees and information.

Measure Excellence: Assess the level of performance and reputation within the community.

Identify Community Assets: Identify existing resources, skills, and expertise within the community that could be leveraged to support new community initiatives and programming.

Tracking Changes Over Time: Establish baseline data and track changes over time.

Informing Resource Allocation & Future Planning: Provide data to inform decision-making, planning, and resource allocation for programming and services within the community.

Feedback/Action Steps

- New Offerings: add in house softball, fencing, mountain biking, dance, cheer, lacrosse, intro to sports opportunities, secondary fitness, floor hockey, high school ski club, and pickleball.
- More Offerings: for gymnastics, archery.

 Communication: clear communication
- Communication: clear communication for time commitments before signing up and throughout the season. Develop communication about where to register (community ed versus school).

Each program area is analyzed to meet responses and support district Strategic Plan.

Implement programming during school day: FLEX time and lunch periods

What programs would you like to see that provide students with real-world experiences like career exploration or life skill development?

Career Exploration

- Preparing for a career: practice job interviewing, preparing job applications, help with resumes
- Service: intergenerational opportunities, opportunities to impact local community, opportunities for students to volunteer in our schools
- Preparation: How to prepare in middle school for future success
- Career Presenters: Explore what different careers are like, hands-on opportunities, more career day opportunities, field trips, local company tours
- Intern & Job Fairs: Create fairs for students
- Connections for Job Shadowing and Mentorship
- **Starting a Business:** Learning from Entrepreneurs

Life Skills

- Mental Health: coping strategies, use of technology, setbacks
- Environmental: gardening, conservation, taking care of Farth
- Finance: Basic finance skills, money management and saving, money literacy, paying taxes, preparing to buy a home/rent an apartment, writing a check/paying bills, investing
- Correspondence: Communicating via email
- **Language**: language classes before or after school-conversational and cultural outings
- Home Skills like cooking, laundry, and cleaning
- Life fitness like swimming and biking
- Understanding Government: Trip to State Capitol and understanding decision making
- Cultural Awareness: Learning about cultures and diversity

Communications Internship: Summer of 2024

- Supervised and trained by Alice Seuffert, Director of Communications, Mahtomedi Public Schools.
- During her internship, Olivia managed the CE social media accounts, oversaw the CE web page, and developed a communications plan to support the department.
- During her internship, we saw the following results:
 - Instagram: 3,415% increase in reach from June to August
 - Facebook: 225% increase in reach from June to August
 - In both accounts, we saw a significant increase in the amount of non-follower reach as well as overall engagement.
