



Governor Dunleavy Cancelled School

On March 13, as a precaution in the face of the global COVID-19 Pandemic, Alaska Governor Dunleavy cancelled all K-12 schools until March 30. Most regrettable, the 1A Boys and Girls Basketball tournament was cancelled. Since our CTE Week 3 was scheduled during this time, that special event was cancelled as well. Skiku and Alaska Nordic were also cancelled. School staff reported to work, but no student activities took place during those two weeks. For the remainder of the school year, students will have homework packets to complete and return each week. Some high school students will be allowed to borrow school computers to work at home. At this time, the status of the Graduation ceremonies is uncertain.







The Reality of Home School

Starting March 17, breakfasts and lunches were available at the school as take-out. Starting March 23, teachers prepared homework packets for students. It has not been easy for anyone, but we are all working together to minimize the risks for Covid-19 infection.

It is spreading rapidly. As of March 18 there were 216,629 cases world-wide, with 6,668 in the U.S. and 3 in Alaska. As of March 18, 8,908 people died of Covid-19, including 117 in the U.S. As of March 26, there were over 500,000 cases world-wide, with over 75,000 in the U.S. and 59 in Alaska. As of March 26, over 23,000 people died world-wide, including 1,000 in the U.S., and one in Alaska.

Students are encouraged to do their homework at home. Call the school to talk to your teacher if you have any questions. Return the homework to the school in the Bins in the Wolf Commons on Friday when you pick up lunch. Or you can take a picture of your homework and send it to Dale at 907-493-2101.
