## 6. REPORTS

## A. Parent Involvement: Kim Carlson

Andrea Lund is the Parent Involvement Coordinator. 26 mini-grant proposals were submitted and approximately \$3000 was awarded. Will review this program for possible elimination due to budget reductions in Community Education budget. A lot is accomplished with a small amount of money.

## B. Elementary Student Handbooks: Anita Underberg

Revision is slight clarification to chaperone requirements – "Only designated chaperones who accompany the class to and from school will be allowed with the group on a field trip."

## C. Preliminary General Budget: Chuck Klaassen, Tina Burkholder

Side note – Received a \$51,000 rebate from SFM for workers comp goals being met. Acknowledged work of Eric Hamilton and Tami Johnson.

Preliminary budget includes 0% change in basic foundation aid funding formula. Not much to review from the legislative session since no education bill was passed. Staffing levels are held constant along with supply and service budgets. Projected revenues of \$51,915,377 and expenditures of \$52,392,392. Past reductions have enabled the district to maintain overall long-term stability. Final budget for 2010-11 will be presented for approval on June 29<sup>th</sup>.

Superintendent acknowledged work of Chuck and Tina during the last 3 years through budget reductions, etc., and being able to maintain a positive budget and posture for this district for next year and the following.

## 7. COMMITTEE REPORTS

PP – NWSISD JAG newsletter by students is well done.

DO – Community Ed – budget review, city partnerships, loss of SPARK program at Hanover, sampler activities program for 3-4 year olds.

SL – Foundation - \$3600 from pork chop dinner will provide 2 scholarships. SHIP – Statewide Health Improvement Program - \$275,000 available for grant money.

MB – SEE – lobbyist was disappointed with legislative sessions, met the Independent Party candidate for Governor.

RM – High School leadership meetings – acknowledged how staff continue to be concerned with student success.

## 8. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- NWSISD communications staff from all the districts have met and are looking at combined efforts.
- Legislation 70-30 split and possibility of withholding funds, possibility of new requirement regarding physical education
- Formally wanted to thank Chuck for his many years of service to the district as Director of Community Education and Finance and Operations.
