RESPECT WEEK—2017

North Valley High School celebrated #Respect Week January 13-20. The week was the brainchild of Sophomore Joel Crawford. "Last year I attended an OASC (Oregon Association of Student Councils) conference," explained Crawford, "and one of the classes I went to was about getting participation in events from 100% of our students. I served on the board for the Special Olympics and have worked with the Special Olympics basketball team and it just got me thinking about the students the Special Olympics serve. I've been cut from teams before and it hurts and I just felt like this was a group of students who, in a way, are cut from everything. They aren't recognized for their efforts, they attend rallies but don't play any of the games, etc. So, I decided to plan a week that would spotlight the students who rarely get to be in the spotlight." Crawford asked fellow students to help and the committee of Thomas Baldridge, a senior, Bridget O'Dell, a Junior, and Ashley-Dean Myers, a Senior, was formed.

#Respect week began on January 13 with an assembly. Students had videotaped short interviews of other students and staff asking the question "What does respect mean to you?" Those interviews were compiled into a video that opened the assembly. O'Dell brought the 500 or so students and staff to tears in her speech as she talked about the challenges she has faced. "I

have a learning disability," she explained, "it has always been a huge challenge to me in life because of my disability. Three years ago when I started at North Valley I was really shy. I couldn't even get up in front of a classroom and talk and now I'm talking in front of all of you!" She went on to explain how she sits on the bus every day and listens to how people talk to each other and how much it hurts her to hear it. She ended her speech with this advice: "Everyone deserves a chance. Everyone can become stronger people if you give them a chance." The students and staff responded with resounding applause and a standing ovation for O'Dell.

That same evening a dance was held in the Commons after the basketball game. In the spirit of #Respect Week, many of O'Dell's classmates were nominated for



#Respect royalty. Over 100 students attended and voted for their king and queen as the entered the dance. O'Dell was voted queen and Kamari Blacksmith was voted king.

Throughout the week Respect Ambassadors kept an eye for fellow students showing random acts of respect. These students were handed a ticket which they were able to exchange for a t-shirt that read "I got caught showing respect!" on the back.

Thursday, January 19, the entire school was treated to a basketball game between the staff and the students. Several varsity players joined North Valley's Special Olympics Basketball team and while both teams worked hard to be successful, the game ended in a 22-22 tie. This is the second year #Respect has been held at North Valley and it has quickly become a favorite event and new tradition in Knight Country.
