Our Brackett Cross Country runners delivered standout performances at the District 30-2A Cross Country Meet in Falls City today with multiple top finishes and several runners qualifying for regionals.

In the Junior High Boys division, Orion Martinez claimed the title of District Champion, while teammate Sammie Stewart finished strong in 2nd place. Weston Massingill and Onefre Riojes rounded out the team’s performance, placing 9th and 17th, respectively.

Junior High Girls also showed grit on the course, led by Bridget Buitron, who placed 4th. Natalie Cardenas (11th), Natalia Sandoval (13th), and Victoria Villarreal (18th) all turned in solid performances.
