




Amp Up

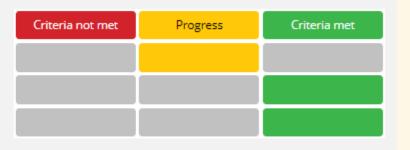



Mask Protocols for SY 21-22
