Twenty-seven schools in the Denton Independent School District received special recognition from Texas Education Agency for their significant gains on different portions of the Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills and other accountability areas.

These 27 schools – 10 secondary schools and 17 elementary – received at least one Gold Performance Acknowledgment (GPA), which recognizes campuses for their high performance levels.

The local district jumped from 37 for the 2006-07 school year to 66 GPA awards for the 2007-08 school year. This means the district improved considerably at the higher level of academic performance targets, school officials said.

Two educators recognized by TAEA

Dalton Gregory, retired Denton ISD principal, and Denise Clyne-Ruch, Nelson Elementary art teacher, recently were recognized at the Texas Art Education Association's annual conference in San Antonio.

Dalton Gregory, who retired as principal of Ryan Elementary in June, received the TAEA Principal of the Year award, and Denise Clyne-Ruch received the 2008 Outstanding Elementary School Division Art Educator.

Mr. Gregory retired after 34 years in education and 26 years with Denton ISD. While at Ryan, he led the school to "Recognized" status and in 2006, the fourth-grade students had a 100 percent passing rate on the writing portion of Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills. During his 15 years at Lee Elementary, Gregory facilitated an alternative calendar for students. Lee was the district's only school with a "year-round" schedule, which they had until 2001.

Ms. Clyne-Ruch is in her 18th year of teaching. She received her master's of art education and museum studies from the University of North Texas. She is a TAEA Area III representative and is involved with workshops and continuing education for art educators. Ms. Cline-Ruch teaches art to 600 students at Nelson every week.

The Texas Art Education Association recognizes outstanding members of the association, friends of art education, and campus principals at the organization's annual awards program.

The purpose of TAEA is to raise the standards of art education and the teaching of art throughout the state, to promote art as an integral part of the curriculum, and to represent the art educators of Texas at different levels.

District honored for music education

For the third time, the Denton Independent School District has been named as a "Best Community for Music Education in America." The school district also attained this honor in 2007 and in 2004.

It was one of only 10 in Texas to make the list. This is a great honor for Denton ISD because it is based on providing music as an integral part of every student's education. The local district was selected for its commitment to school-based music programs.

The National Association of Music Merchants Foundation and its American Music Conference division, which both work to promote the benefits of active participation in music and music education, sponsored the survey.

According to the results of the survey, recipients of this distinction cite increased enrollment in and funding for school music programs.

Thousands of teachers, administrators, school board members, parents and community leaders participated in the Web-based survey. The 2008 roster includes school districts from 29 states that are committed to quality music education programs and providing access to music education. The districts were measured across a variety of program support, curricular and programmatic criteria.
