1. What Arrangements have been made for administering necessary medications to students while on this trip?

I will take the training needed and also work with the BBHCSD health staff to see if we can get someone to travel with us.

We will also have some parent chaperones who are registered nurses/EMT who are traveling with us (if needed to be used).

2. What arrangements have been made for dealing with emergency situations? Who will be responsible for all medical information sheets? How will the forms be stored and transported?

All of the protocols will be the same as the past. We have used a district employee who has been approved by the high school leadership as well as district leadership to be responsible for the paperwork, distributing medication at the hotel and on the bus, and for the returning of medication upon arrival from the trip back to BBHHS.

Since this trip is in a future school year, there are no problems to list. I have been in the district since the 2005-2006 school year and this would be my 13 th trip in the district (8 with the orchestra & choir, 3 with the band, 1 as a department) with all of the trips being out of the state of Ohio.

9. How many chaperones, in addition to staff members, will be going? What are their names and affiliations with the students?

Names of the Chaperones have not been determined yet, but there will be one chaperone per 4-8 kids.

10. Will school days be missed? If so, how many? How will teachers be advised in advance that the students will be out of school? How will missed work be made up? What special assistance will be provided to students with academic problems?

We would miss three days of school right before Spring Break. Students will have the opportunity to use class time prior to departure to work on assignments and projects. Missed assignments can also be made up when we return.

There is no cost to the organization, so the trip is fully funded by the families. We will provide some fundraising opportunities to help. We will also have some money set aside to help families who are in need.

Day One – Wednesday, March 23, 2027

Depart	Depart Brecksville/Broadview Heights High School this morning to begin your journey to New York City. (Approximate drive time is 7 hours without stops, 452 miles.)
Arrival	Welcome to New York City! Your Gateway Tour Manager will greet you upon arrival.
Brooklyn Bridge	After the long drive, get off the motorcoach and walk on the Brooklyn Bridge. The bridge is one of the oldest suspension bridges in the United States. Completed in 1883, it connects the boroughs of Manhattan and Brooklyn by spanning the East River.
One World Observatory	Board one of five dedicated elevators and ascend to the 102nd floor of the observatory in under 60 seconds, with 360-degree views in all directions, taking in the iconic sights, surrounding waters and panoramic views of the city and beyond. The Main Observatory also features the Sky Portal, where you will step onto a 14-foot-wide circular disc with an unforgettable view, using real-time, high-definition footage of the streets below.

New York Optional Activities

9/11 Memorial

Visit the site of the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks on the United States. 9/11 Museum

The Memorial Museum, located at the World Trade Center site, is to bear solemn witness to the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001 and February 26, 1993. The Museum honors the nearly 3,000 victims of these attacks and all those who risked their lives to save others.

The FDNY Memorial Wall

A fifty-six-foot-long bronze wall of cast bas-relief bronze honors those firefighters who gave their lives in service to the public on September 11, 2001. It contains the names of every active member of the department who perished in the collapse of the Towers. It is comprised of fourteen individual bronze panels brazed together into an artwork weighing over three tons; the monument tribute is set into the west wall of Engine Company 10 – Ladder Company 10 on the corner of Greenwich and Liberty Streets. “Ten House” was damaged in the collapse of the Twin Towers, sitting directly south of the former World Trade Center Plaza.

Broadway Theater

Aida, Beauty & The Beast, Chicago, Grease, 42nd Street, Phantom of the Opera, and many more. You must catch a show on Broadway while you are in the Big Apple!

Carnegie Hall

This world-famous concert hall began construction in 1890. Learn about the story of Andrew and Louise Carnegie, hear how the Hall was saved from demolition in 1960, and experience a century-long performance tradition that has showcased the world's finest artists – from Tchaikovsky to Mahler, Horowitz to Callas to Bernstein, even Judy Garland and the Beatles.

Central Park

Over 840 acres of landscaped and recreational areas stretching from 59th to 110th streets include a zoo, theater, sports facilities, lakes, food, and entertainment.

Chinatown

New York City's Chinatown it is the largest Chinatown in the United States. It is the center of politics, economics, and culture of the Chinese communities in New York City. Statue of Liberty & Ellis Island

America's favorite symbol of freedom and the entry point for thousands of emigrants over the past centuries. Ferry departs daily from Battery Park and Liberty Park.

Tribeca – TRIangle BElow CANal Street

New York City's hottest neighborhood. This is home to some of the most exciting restaurants and nightspots in the city. Walk to the Financial District, City Hall, or tour Wall Street.
