






WELCOME

Let's get creative! The Iñupiat people have been surviving in the Arctic for thousands of years despite the severely dangerous temperatures and lack of resources. This is due to the great minds of past generations creating parkas to keep their body warm, mukluks to protect their feet, and umiaks to hunt whales for food. They even made a musical instrument called the qilaun, an Iñupiaq drum. That same creativity lies within each and every student in our District.

Teachers in our village schools that were hired to teach core classes like math and science, have tried their best to accomedate the desire for music classes as much as possible. We, as the Qatqiññiaġvik department, now have the ability to help them. We are able to team up with any teacher at a particular site to bring musical instruction. This can be done through on-site visits, flying students out or teachers in for intensive courses, and distance delivery via videoconferencing platforms like *Zoom*. It takes a lot of creative ideas to make this work around shifting sports' schedules, technology issues, and teacher turnover.

With this team effort, kids from Elementary to High School can finally start their journey down the road of music performance and production. Imagine our students bridging together the skills to create from their ancestors, and the knowledge of performing and recording music from our schools. Sky is the limit!
