 - Program Directors send letters and digital communications to identified students and their families, providing details about the program and how to register.
 - Our team maintains close communication with families, offering support and answering questions to encourage participation and address any concerns.

Target Students

- Support Summer Bridge Program
 - Students enrolled in literacy or double-block math for their freshman year in school.
 - Students that are identified by sender schools as at-risk and needing transition assistance.
- Accelerated Summer Bridge
 - Students newly enrolled in Honors or AP courses for their freshman year.
 - Students identified by their PSAT Scores as having high academic potential and benefiting from advanced preparation for challenging coursework.

Program Goals

- Support Summer Bridge Program
 - To provide targeted activities that ease students' transition into JTHS for the Class of 2029.
 - To facilitate social-emotional learning (SEL) growth and development through team-building activities and fostering positive peer relationships.
 - To improve overall school readiness by developing crucial study skills and academic habits.
- Accelerated Summer Bridge
 - To provide foundational knowledge and study strategies specific to the demands of Honors and AP coursework.
 - To foster advanced analytical and problem-solving skills essential for success in higher-level classes.
 - To enhance student confidence and preparedness for the rigors and expectations of an accelerated academic curriculum.

Findings and Future Considerations

- As appropriate, summer bridge should continue to be offered for incoming freshmen.
- Student performance and participation in the 25-26 school year will be tracked to measure success of the summer bridge programs.
- Our decision to pivot from a single 3-week summer bridge program to two distinct, shorter targeted programs this summer proved successful. Both programs experienced strong participation, demonstrating that concise, specialized support resonates more strongly with students.
- Transportation should continue to be provided for Summer Bridge at both campuses.
