

Hidden Valley is about to become part of one of the largest 'telescopes' in the world. Mr. Earley applied for and won a grant to get a cosmic ray detector as part of the ERGO project; the Energetic Ray Global Observatory. This project is equipping school rooms with detectors to measure and count Cosmic Ray showers. There are several hypotheses as to the origin or these high energy particles, which are not rays at all. The main hypothesis is that the Cosmic Rays originate in supernovae- exploding stars. Studying the frequency and distribution of Cosmic Rays might help us to determine is this is true. The detector is assembled and ready to install. We hope to have it operational in a week or two. Students will be able to see the data collection, and assist in the analysis of the results of the project.

In the event of adverse weather conditions parents are advised to tune in to Radio Stations KRWQ, KAJO, KLDR, KBOY and TV Stations KOBI (5), KDRV (12), KTVL (10) or the Three Rivers School District Web Page (<a href="https://www.threerivers.k12.or.us">www.threerivers.k12.or.us</a>) for information on school bus schedules, delays or closures.

Sometimes weather conditions leave some roads blocked or unsafe to travel but school is still being held. Under these circumstances "straight line routes" will be run. This is the information you will get on the web page or radio/TV stations.

When straight line routes are run the roads affected are listed below. If you live on one of the roads the buses cannot travel, you may bring your student to the nearest intersection of the main road traveled. This will also be the stop for the afternoon drop off.
