#### MAKING IT HAPPEN AT IVHS!

As we approach the two-thirds mark in this school year, and the job ahead for the final third seems overwhelming, I am reminded of a statement by Teddy Roosevelt: "Far and away the best prize that life has to offer is the chance to work hard at work worth doing." What we are doing is worth doing and we have a school full of staff who is working hard to accomplish it. I am blessed to be leading an amazing group of folks who care so much about our students. As always, we are a busy place with lots going on. Some highlights of the 2<sup>nd</sup> trimester are as follows:

### PARENT TEACHER CONFERENCES

Although we continue to struggle to find ways to get the parents of high school students to conferences, we did see an increase in attendance for the second trimester. I made phone calls to 159 parents of students that were failing. We saw an 8% increase from last year for second trimester. We had about 45% of the students represented by a parent during the two days of conferences. While it was the highest of the three high schools in the district, it is not as high as we would like. Increasing parent involvement will always be something we will look to increase.

## SENIOR PROJECT PRESENTATIONS

The majority of our seniors have now successfully completed their senior projects. The few students who have not attempted a presentation and the few students who did not pass their first try will have the opportunity to complete at the end of April. The final round of presentations this last week was impressive. It is so rewarding to see how mature and thoughtful these students have become over their high school careers.

# 21<sup>st</sup> Century Classes

Illinois Valley High School is currently offering our students seven different options for after school classes as well as Homework Help, Tutoring, and Academic Support as part of our after school 21<sup>st</sup> Century Program. Student attendance at after school programs is increasing as students become familiar with the program.

## COUGAR TREK

Right now we have nearly 150 students who are eligible to go bowling for the second Cougar Trek this year. #### JOB COUNCIL CONNECTION

Illinois Valley High School is beginning a partnership with the Southern Oregon Job Council to help provide our students career readiness training and job skills. During the third trimester, a group of students will be working during and after school on projects with local businesses and agencies. We are excited to open the door to possible careers with these students and get them a jump start on learning the skills necessary to succeed in the workforce.

#### POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION

With the help of College Dreams and our SMILE Program, we work hard to get as many kids as possible onto college campuses. Students have visited the University of Oregon, Oregon State, Lane Community College, George Fox, and OIT. We recently had RCC on campus and they administered placement tests to roughly 50 students. We strongly believe that exposing students to these possibilities will increase the likelihood that they will see post-secondary education as a part of their futures.

#### BATTLE OF THE BOOKS

A new program at IVHS has been started - THE BATTLE OF THE BOOKS. Students will be invited to start reading from a list of books and compete at the state competition. Megan Brown is coaching the team this year and they competing this month at regionals.

Congratulations to our Wrestling program as they have gualified ten wrestlers for the state tournament in Portland on February 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>. Logan Miller, Brandon Parker, TJ Hughey, Julian Northrup, Eric Miller, John Britt, and Zach Clark all punched their tickets weekend at Regionals at Lakeview High School. This past weekend the guys went up to the state meet and competed real hard.
