


What specific educational needs or goals do you have for your child?


## What role do school facilities and resources play in your choice?

83 responses




## How do you perceive the school's reputation?




## What educational values do you prioritize for your child?


Would you support a referendum to prevent cuts to staffing, activities and/or programs?
