Woodbridge Philosophy on Open Choice

Our goal is to have each Open Choice student receive the full benefit of a BRS Educational Experience. To that end, it is our philosophy to start students in Kindergarten or as close to Kindergarten as possible. When and if a sibling of a current Open Choice student applies, we review each application on a case by case basis (grade level entering, etc.) with the program to ensure student success.

The Board of Education has the following guidelines for class size:

Gr. K-3 = 17-19 and Gr. 4-6 19-21

There are currently 43 rooms dedicated as classrooms in Beecher Road School with the potential of two additional classrooms without significantly impacting program and curriculum delivery.

State Funding

The state pays a school district that accepts students ("receiving district") the following grants:

- \$3,000 per student to districts where Open Choice students are less than 2% of the district's total student population.
- ❖ \$4,000 per student for districts with 2% to 3% Open Choice enrollment.
- \$6,000 per student for districts with Open Choice enrollment of at least 3% of total enrollment.
