

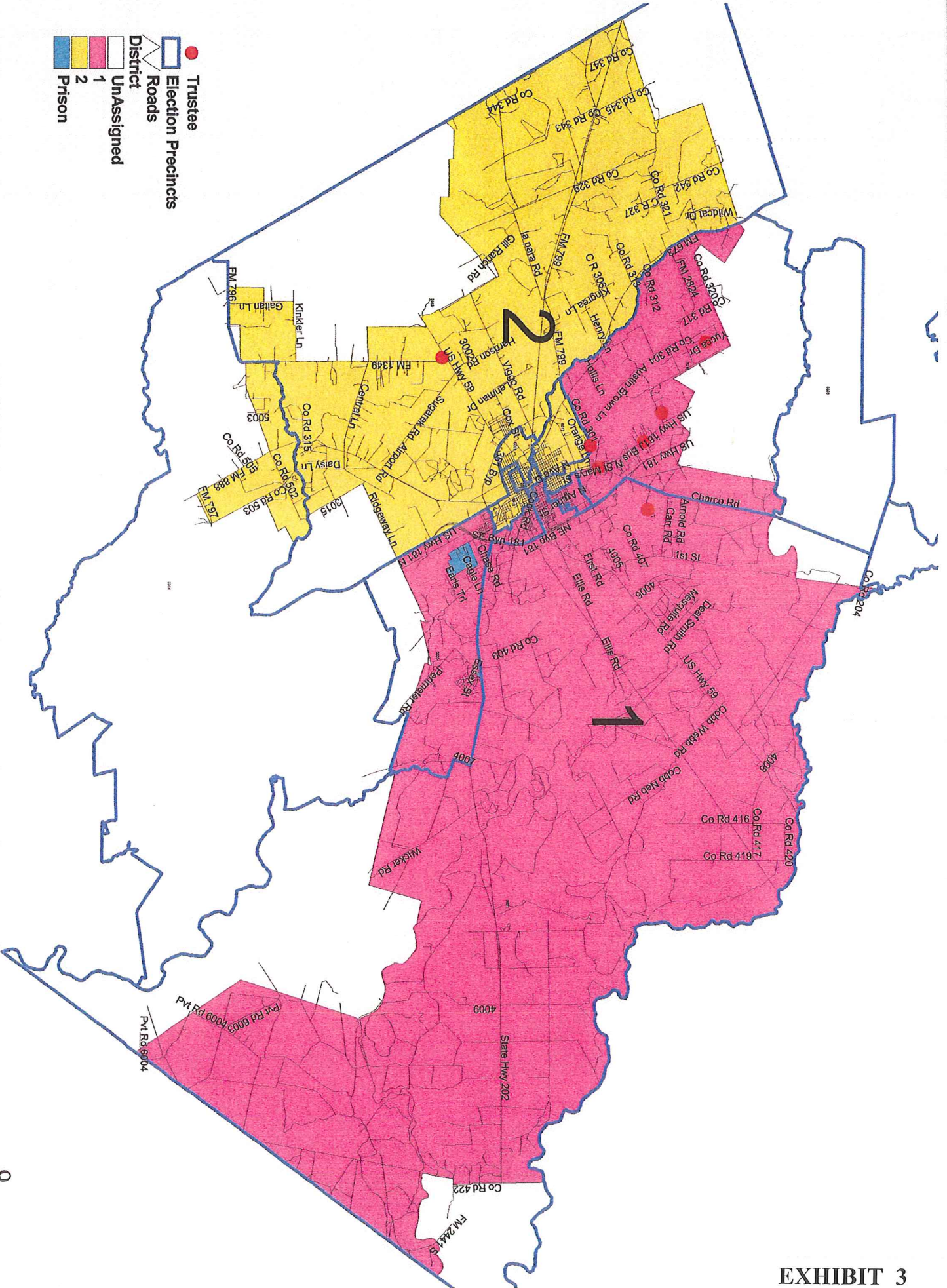
GUIDELINES FOR REDISTRICTING YOUR SINGLE-MEMBER DISTRICTS

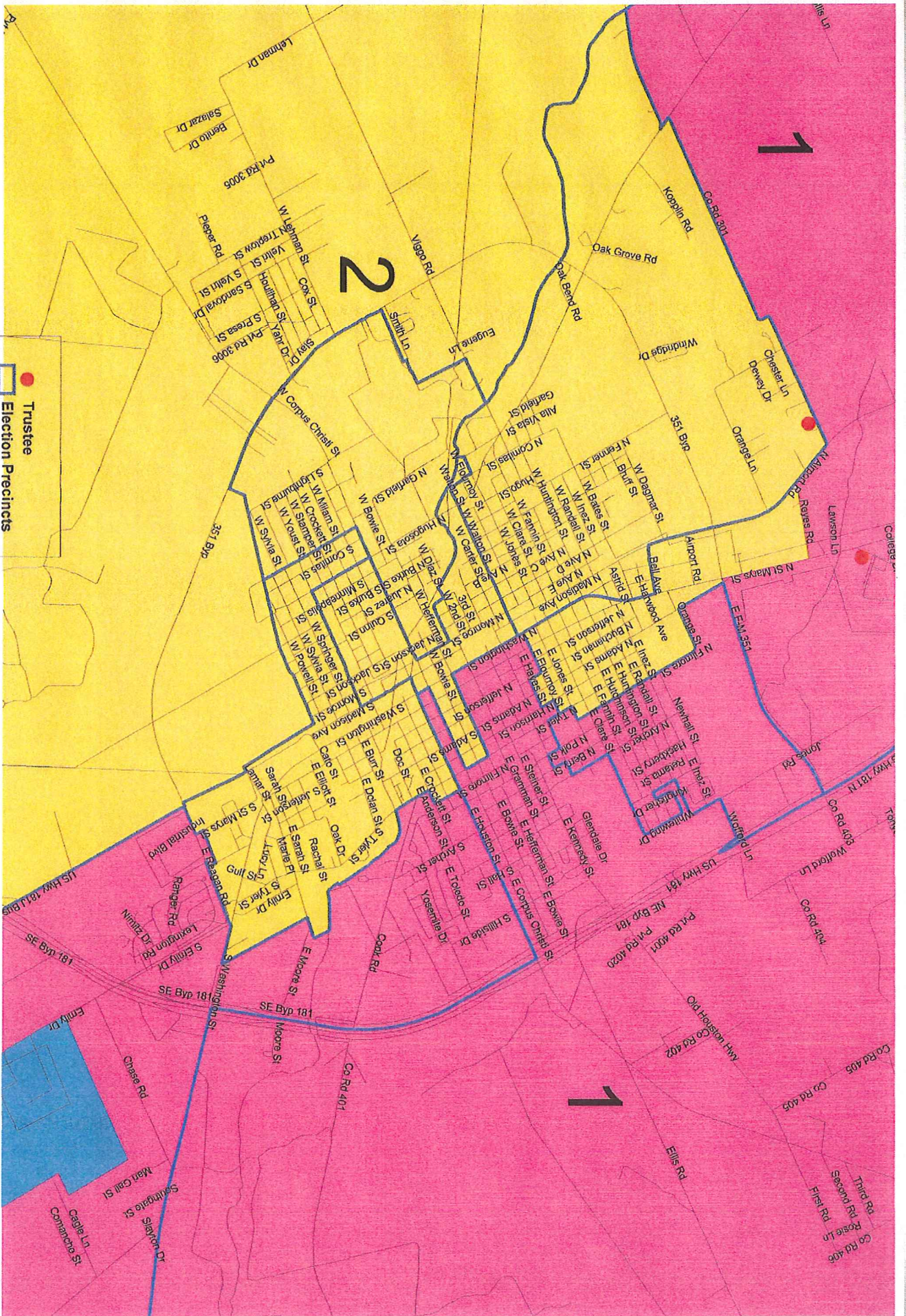
EXHIBIT 2

1. Draw districts to contain similar total population size. The maximum deviation from the smallest to the largest populated district should not exceed 10%, (+) or (-) 5%. (ONE PERSON, ONE VOTE PRINCIPLE)
2. Draw districts that contain contiguous and compact geographic areas. (CONTIGUITY FACTOR)
3. Use identifiable geographic features as boundaries.
4. Maintain communities of interest and minimize dividing neighborhoods, when possible.
5. Recognize value of incumbent-constituency relations by locating current government members in separate districts.
6. Maintain racial and/or language minority population as a community of interest in one or more single-member districts, if possible. Evaluate minority voting strength in terms of voting age population.
7. Follow guidelines as defined in the Voting Rights Act. Avoid “retrogression”: if possible do not make the relevant minority group worse off relative to the current plan. (RETROGRESSION FACTOR)

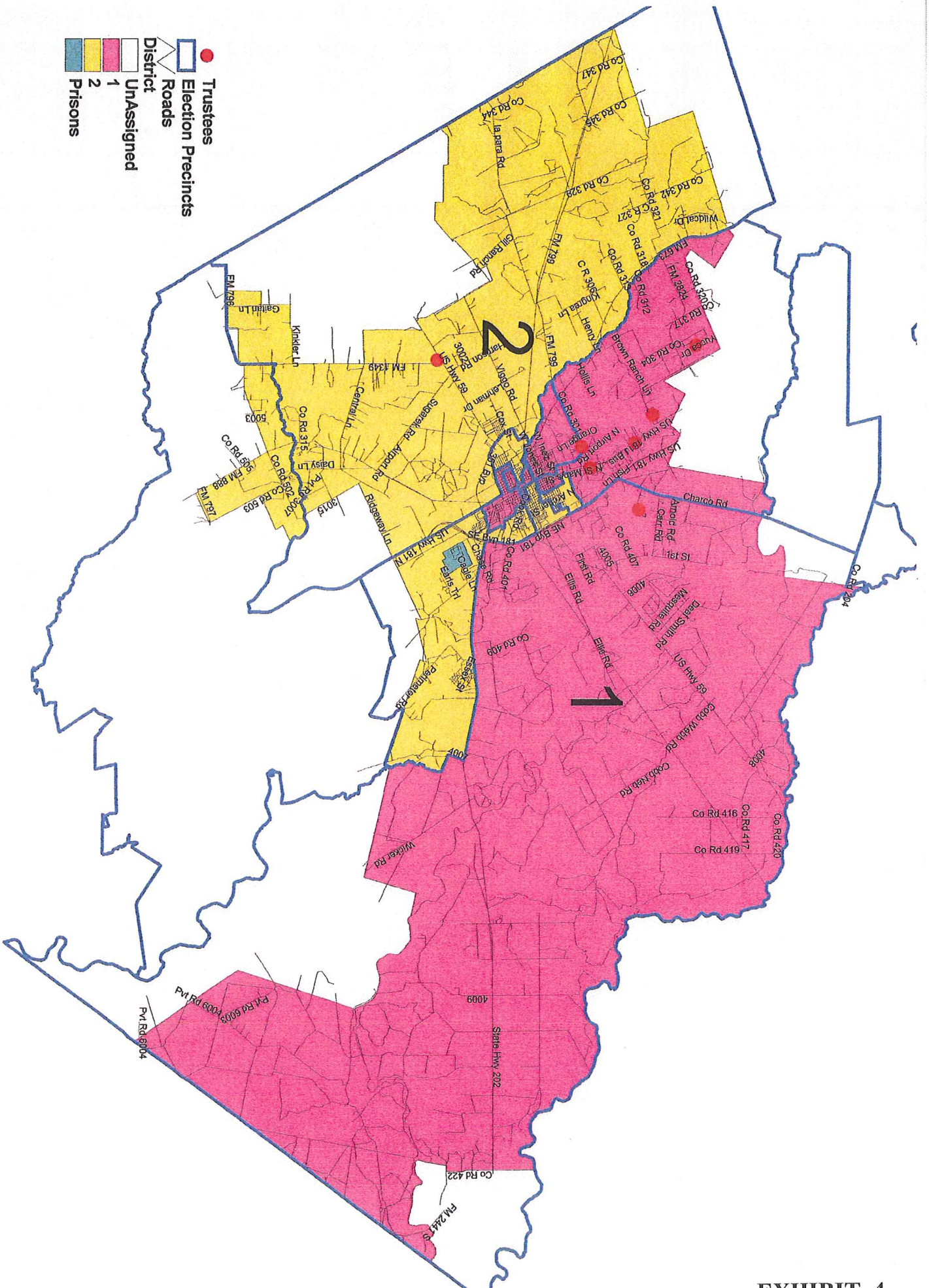

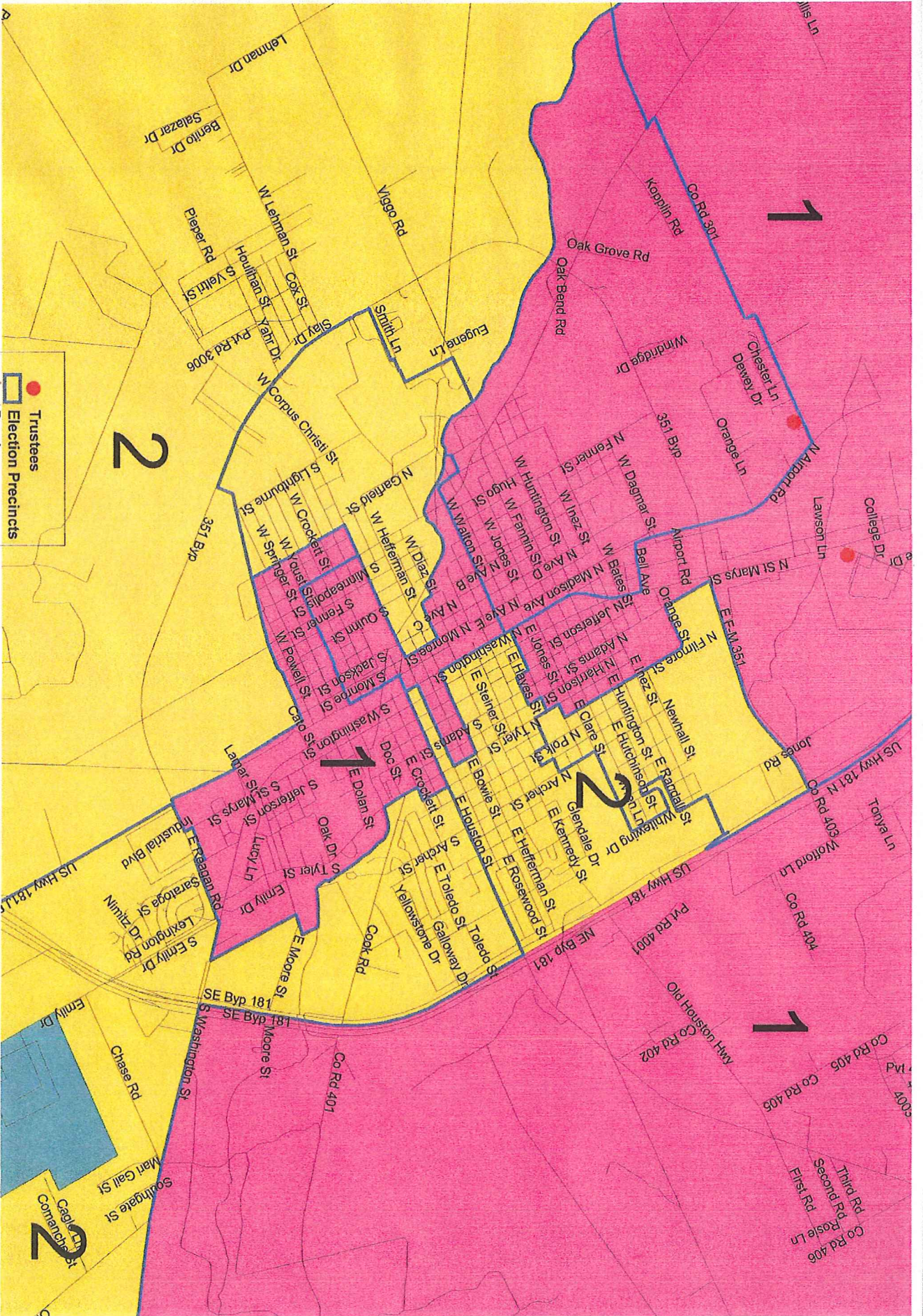

The Redistricting Advisory Committee (RAC) of the Beeville Independent School District met at 6:00 p.m. on September 12, 2011 at 201 North St. Mary's Street, Beeville, Texas.

Note: Mr. Garza did not call to say he would be absent. Committee members also were not aware of any reason for his absence. He came the next morning (September 13) to pick up the redistricting handout from the meeting. He said he forgot about the meeting.

Topics and Information Presented/Discussed:

Dr. Thomas introduced Attorney Judy Brown of Walsh, Anderson, Brown, Gallegos & Green, P.C. in Austin, Texas; and Leslie Johnston of Johnston & Associates in Tow, Texas.

Ms. Brown explained the need for redistricting and the guidelines for the process. Ms. Johnston reviewed the trustee multi-member election districts, other changes to the trustee election system, and redistricting options.

The RAC members considered two draft plans, Plan 2-A and Plan 2-B, provided by the demographer. The RAC members agreed that having easily identifiable boundaries would be important for voters' understanding of the new plan and for the administration of elections under the new plan.

All RAC members unanimously agreed that the 2-B plan created better boundaries and created two multi-member districts with an even percentage of Hispanic population at 66.3% each.

John Galloway was appointed Committee Chair.

Decisions regarding future meetings and additional information/request needed:

No further meetings were necessary as the committee was in total agreement.

The hearing adjourned at 7:36 p.m.
