Third Grade is ready for GREATNESS in the weeks to come...

Third graders has started of the new year working hard and will continue to work hard this next month! This month in science third grade is starting to learn about different kinds of land changes. They are learning about different natural disasters, how they change earth and how to prepare for them. By the end of the month they will begin learning about soil and all its many layers. In social studies students will be finishing up economics by producing their own product. They will come up with a business plan and a budget for creating their product. They then will create an advertisement showing why their product is better than anyone else's. To end the project they will sell their product at market day where they have to make sure they display and talk up their item to sell out. After they will look at how much money their made, subtract what they spent creating the product, and see who earned a profit. In reading students will continue to have fiction and nonfiction passages spiraled into their work. Students will be working hard to prepare for their benchmark and will practice the skills they have learned this year. In math students are creating Valentine's Day boxes out of geometric shapes. They are competing again each other to make the most creative box and also using the most geometric shapes. The students have also started to work on their multiplication facts and testing their knowledge to earn a movie ticket along with popcorn and candy. The more facts you master the more goodies you get at the movie.

Our 4th graders are ready to GROW!

January was a full month of learning for our Fantastic Fourth Graders! Fourth grade students came back from the holidays ready to work!

Students have rapped in reading learning point of view. 4th grade students are diving into poetry, studying the structural elements this week. Soon students will look at figurative language, learning how to identify it, understand it, and use it. They are using quotation marks in writing. 4th grade writers have start a daily journal to improve writing skills and are focusing on how to use quotation marks and correct punctuation for dialogue. They are also continuing their study of homophones.

Math-During math students are using their skills learned before Christmas to problem solve with fractions. Our Mathematicians are finishing up working with fractions and starting geometry.

Sci As scientist they are identifying energy forms and their uses. Fourth grade Scientists are also exploring electricity and circuits.

The second semester has started strong and challenging to encourage our students to succeed!

Fabulous Fifth Graders are Working Hard this Month!

5th grade has a lot going on in February! Social Studies is beginning to delve into the Oregon Trail, moving West, the Gold Rush, and inventions. ELAR is creating board games that require students to reflect on what they have learned since the first six weeks of school. This will help prepare them for their upcoming benchmark. Classes have started their second novel study, Something Upstairs. Math classes continue to review previously learned material. On Thursday and Friday, students who have mastered the concepts from the week are given the opportunity to create a variety of projects to display their knowledge. We have some very creative kids! In science, students have been exploring the processes that led to the formation of sedimentary rocks and fossil fuels. Students created a "how-to" chart that compared and contrasted the processes involved. Students will now be collaborating with their classmates in creating advertisements that explain the importance of using alternative energy resources instead of burning fossil fuels. Students will explain how the resource works, where the resource is used mostly, and what the resource is used for in the world. Towards the end of the month students will be demonstrating how several landforms are created by wind, water, or ice. All students and teachers are working hard to prepare for the upcoming benchmarks.

Artists at HIS are going to create their clay projects this month. 3rd will make clay cupcakes, 4th will make fish and 5th will make clay roses. Then we will work on watercolor paintings, 3rd will paint landscapes and add castles made of foil, 4th will

paint farm landscapes, and 5th will paint a still life of flowers in a vase. Art is so much fun!

3rd grade is learning to cut, copy and paste without using scissors or glue. 4th grade is learning to use Google Drawing tools. It is a very powerful image creator and editor. 5th graders are still working on earning their Google Basic Skills Driver's License.

The Compass Math program is helping our students to fill in what is sometimes deep math gaps. The Reflex Math website is helping us to greatly improve upon our math facts.

3-5th math were very impressive by demonstrating a strong work ethic as they returned to the classroom. This week 3rd grade has been refreshing knowledge of geometry, 4th grade has been assessing their knowledge of fractions, and 5th grade has been reviewing and fine tuning their skills on order of operations.

The Life Skills classroom is exploring a unit designed around health topics. Health education emphasizes not only what to do when we are sick, but how to stay healthy as well. This unit relates to healthy eating, physical exercise and knowing the basic information on healthcare provisions. We are providing healthy snacks daily such as dried fruits and different nuts so children can try new snacks. It's a great start to a Healthy & Happy 2018!

In February the students of Eagle Reading Academy/Tier 3 Reading will review and practice before, during and after reading "Reading Strategies that I used today".
