Another report by the WIsconsin Policy Forum outlined the sharp rise in homeschool students in the state of Wisconsin during the 2020-21 school year. While enrollments across the state increased by 47% during the year, which is the largest increase since 1984, Frederic's homeschool students stayed relatively flat, with 20 families totalling 34 students. This was up just slightly from the prior year of 18 families and 33 students.
