Agenda Item: Consider and take action regarding approving the Proclamation to recognize October 2025 as Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

CONSENT ITEM

RECOMMENDATION:

To approve October 2025 as Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

IMPACT/RATIONALE:

In 1985, October was designated as National Breast Cancer Awareness Month to raise awareness about this major public health concern. Breast cancer is the most prevalent cancer among women in the United States and other countries (American Public Health Association, 2015). Organizations like the National Breast Cancer Foundation, the Breast Cancer Research Foundation and Susan G. Komen help spread education and preventative strategies to raise the awareness of breast cancer in our communities.

The American Cancer Society estimates for breast cancer in the United States for 2025 are:

- * Approximately 316,950 new cases of invasive breast cancer will be diagnosed in women.
- * About 59,080 new cases of ductal carcinoma in situ (or DCIS; non-invasive and is the earliest form of breast cancer) will be diagnosed.
- * An estimated 42,170 women and 510 men will die in 2025 as a result of breast cancer.

The purpose of National Breast Cancer Awareness Month is to collectively show support of everyone in the Judson ISD community who is impacted by this disease. This month-long recognition will be devoted to educating our students, staff, and families about breast cancer and the importance of early detection and access to timely, high-quality care.

Breast Cancer Awareness Month Proclamation Judson ISD Board of Trustees

WHEREAS: Each year, hundreds of thousands of Americans are diagnosed with breast cancer and tens of thousands lose their battle with the disease. Screening and early detection are essential as breast cancer is the second most common cancer in women; and

WHEREAS: Breast Cancer Awareness Month is an annual health campaign waged each October to increase awareness of the disease and to raise funds for research into its cause, prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and cure; and

WHEREAS: The National Cancer Institute recommends women have mammograms once per year starting at 40. Adult women of all ages are encouraged to perform breast self-exams once per month as nearly forty percent of diagnosed breast cancers are detected by women who feel a lump; and

WHEREAS: During Breast Cancer Awareness Month, we stand with everyone effected by the disease and recognize the ongoing efforts of the advocates, researchers, and health care providers whose care and hard work gives hope to those living with breast cancer.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Monica Ryan, as by virtue of the authority vested in me as School Board President of the Judson Independent School District Board of Trustees, do hereby proclaim October 2025 as Breast Cancer Awareness Month in the Judson Independent School District, and encourage our community to join in activities that will increase awareness of what individuals can do to prevent and control breast cancer, and pay tribute to those who have lost their lives to this disease.
