Physics and Pre-AP Physics: We have been exploring the concept of the conservation of energy. Using this knowledge the students made a 'car' that was powered by a single mousetrap. We have also just begun creating a roller coaster using only gravitational potential energy.

Biology: We are currently building paper models of DNA and using them to demonstrate Replication, transcription and translation. The translation will include making a protein from their combined DNA molecules

Pre-AP Biology: They are currently building a 3D model of DNA that they designed. They also provided all of the materials. They are then going to complete the unit on cell processes by studying transcription and translation.

AP Biology: Just completed a lab where they determined the sucrose concentration in the fruit or vegetable of their choice. They are currently working on a unit on Macromolecules. They will finish the semester off with an investigation dealing with measuring the amount of peroxidase activity in various living tissues.

Medical Microbiology: They are going to UT Southwestern on a field trip where they will be introduced to gross anatomy using willed organs and also visit a microbiology research lab. They are just finishing an NIH unit on emerging and re-emerging diseases. They will complete the semester by presenting their identification of the unknown that they isolated from areas around the school.
