90% or Better Attendance


This 23/24 school year, we had 3 students with 100% attendance for the entire school year. The students were awarded with a bike and a bluetooth speaker. We also rewarded the parents for all their hard work on getting their students here on time everyday with grills. We had 8 students total that had 97% or better attendance for the entire school year. These students were awarded with basketballs and scooters. We had a total of 39 students at Browning Elementary that had 90% or better attendance. These students were rewarded with basketballs. These 50 students strive to be here everyday.

Students who had 90% or better for the year went to Great Falls to Flippin' Fun for their incentive. Attendance clerk planned and took the students on their trip.


Data Over Two Years for Current 3rd Graders

The AimswebPlus reading data below shows how much improvement we have made with our current third grade students. In 2022-23, we assessed our second grade students on AimswebPlus Reading. In the fall of 2022, there were 71% of second students in Tier 3 with 8% of second students in Tier 1. At that time we knew based on the fall data, we needed to put a plan in place to intervene for instruction to decrease Tier 3. That spring we ended the school year with 69% of second grade students in Tier 3 with 21% in Tier 1.

This year those same cohort of second grade students are now third grade students. This fall of 2023, there were 54% of third grade students in Tier 3 with 24% in Tier 1. Although we knew we had made improvements with this cohort of students, we worked hard this year to provide them the instruction they were in need for skills. This spring of 2024, we ended the school with 56% of third grade students in Tier 3 with 31% of third grade students in Tier 1.




2023-24 ELA data for 3rd grade students






2nd Grade decreased tier 3 from 80% in the Fall to 70% in the Spring. They also increased tier 1 from 6% in the Fall to 23% in the Spring. Second grade made a goal to increase Tier 1 to 21.9% and they exceeded that goal!!!!

Our 2nd grade assessed on Aimsweb Math (below)





3rd Grade increased tier 3 by 2%. In the Fall they were at 54% and increased to 56% in the Spring. Tier 1 increased from 24% in the Fall to 31% in the Spring. 3rd grade made a goal to increase Tier 1 to 20.9% and they exceeded that Goal!!!!


Our 3rd grade assessed on Aimsweb Math (below)



Tier 3 increased from 74% in the Fall to 75% in the Spring. Tier 1 increased from 11% in the Fall to 19% in the Spring.


Science of Writing







The red bar represents Fall data and the green represents Spring data.
