JTHS Suicide Prevention Policy

Joliet Township High School District adopted our policy in acknowledgement of the District's commitment to maintaining a safe school environment by:

- •Understanding the significance of the impact of mental health issues on the school community
- Providing a safeguard against the threat or attempt of suicide among school-aged youth
- •Ensuring that school personnel and students are educated and provided the necessary resources to prevent and promote mental well being
- •Providing resources for students and parent/guardians

Transition for students back to school

JTHS Procedure Review Updates

Assessment Update

PPS staff will continue to utilize the <u>C-SSRS</u> screener with the student to assess the immediacy and intensity of the crisis. All students will continue to be referred to the Threat Assessment Team for review and recommendations.

Transition Plan Update

The PPS staff will set up and facilitate a re-entry meeting in which a plan for academic and social/emotional supports will be developed. The plan shall be uploaded to Infinite Campus under Counseling Documents. This meeting includes the appropriate staff based upon parent request, Threat Assessment Team recommendations and in accordance with district policy. A member of the hospital staff should be invited, however if unavailable to attend, the meeting should still proceed.

The student's triangle team (Counselor, Dean, Social Worker) will monitor the plan and document student progress.
