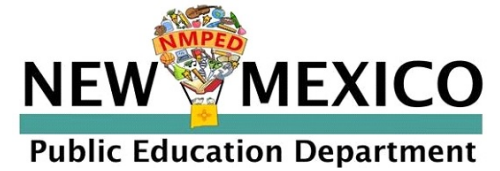

Students must have graduated in order to participate, so it provides added incentive to graduate (Modified and Ability pathway)	By expanding opportunities in middle and high schools by enhancing the variety of courses available for modified and ability pathway students. These funds are utilized to facilitate school-to-work experiences and community-based instruction. We are committed to supporting Project Search, which mandates graduation, thereby offering additional motivation for students.	By increasing the availability of modified option pathways will help retain more students in school. By engaging in programs like Project Search, students will have a better chance of remaining in school and fulfilling the requirements for their diploma pathway, enabling them to apply for Project Search. 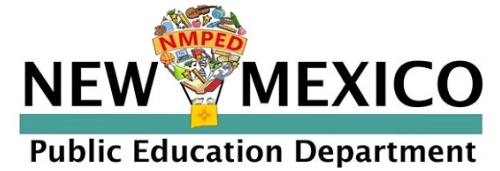
