
Mr. Kelly adjourned the executive session at 7:52 p.m. to reconvene the work session.


Mr. Kelly reconvened the work session at 7:52 p.m.




# RTI and Oregon

NOT Effective	Poor outcomes	Poor outcomes; Sometimes harmful


