The Board of Education of Community Unit School District Number 304 met in a regular session on Monday, April 9, 2012, at 7:00 p.m. at Coultrap, 1113 Peyton, Geneva, Illinois.

3. RECOGNITION, AWARDS, PRESENTATIONS, PUBLIC HEARINGS, BOARD REORGANIZATION

3.1 Tradition of Excellence Award: Student Recognition, Geneva High School National Merit Scholarship Program, IHSA Three-point Shoot Out

The high school principal thanked the Board for the opportunity to present these students in recognition of their achievements.

To achieve National Merit commended status, students placed among the top five percent (above 95th percentile) of more than one million students who entered the 2012 competition by taking the

2010 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. To become a National Merit finalist, students were identified through an additional application and recommendation process. From the original 34,000 Commended students, 16,000 were identified as Semifinalists, and only 8,200 semifinalist candidates qualified for Finalist selection.

IHSA Three-Point Shoot Out Mike Trimble, State Qualifier

Students were presented the Tradition of Excellence Award by the Board and congratulated on their achievements.

3.2 School Improvement Plan Update: Fabyan Elementary School

The principal reviewed Fabyan's school improvement plans which focus on reading, math, writing, and social/emotional awareness. Goals include integrating and evaluating content presented in diverse formats, teaching strategies and skills, using mathematical knowledge to identify important elements in problem solving, developing good writing skills by fostering an appreciation and purpose for writing, and using social awareness and interpersonal skills to establish and maintain positive relationships. Some of the activities and initiatives implemented to support the goals include 90-minute literacy blocks, data gathering, Reading and Science A-Z, Raz Kids, reading tutors, teaching math skills and strategies, item analysis with extended response, math centers, differentiation of math classes, Math Block, Fastmath Lab, in-house student book publishing, third-grade newspaper, PTO Poetry Day, weekly school newsletter, school-wide behavior expectations, Second Step social skills curriculum, Fabyan Falcon Tags, posters/visualizations to reinforce expectations, lunch bunch sessions, and behavior contracts.

3.3 2012 Bright Red Apple Award, School Search

The Superintendent reported that for the eighth year in a row, the District was awarded the Bright Red Apple Award for education excellence by SchoolSearch™, an educational research and consulting firm that publishes rankings of school systems. Geneva C.U.S.D. 304 was one of only 79 Illinois school districts to receive the award. The award criteria are based on academic performance, pupil/teacher ratio, expenditure per pupil, educational level of teachers, and average teacher salary. Geneva was rated strong in all five categories. All 868 Illinois school districts are considered for the award and the award criteria are based on objective factors on which all districts are judged (2011 IL Report Card).

5. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Comments included: The minutes of the Board's 3/17/2012 retreat meeting state the Board will continue to use the Kasarda "B projections;" the projections used for the 2007 referendum are higher than the highest "C" projections in the 2006 Kasarda report. Why were the voters in the 2007 referendum given wrong enrollment projection figures and when can I expect an answer? (Soon.)

6. BOARD DIALOGUE TOPICS & PENDING ACTION CONSIDERATIONS

6.1 Annual Resolution for Dismissal: 2011-2012 Full-time Certificated Teachers 1st, 2nd & 3rd Year The Assistant Superintendent Personnel Services explained that this is an annual process and, per state statute, those teachers whose position may not be required in the coming school year due to budgetary reasons, student enrollment uncertainty, or teachers returning from a leave of absence, must be notified forty-five (45) calendar days prior to the conclusion of the school year. The administration recommended the dismissal of twenty-two first, second and third-year probationary teachers. Dismissing these staff members provides the district with greater flexibility in creating a staffing plan responsive to changes in student enrollment and/or student course selection patterns. When staffing requirements for the 2012-2013 school year are fully identified, the District may be able

to either re-employ dismissed staff members or employ new staff members who can better meet the District's staffing needs.

The Superintendent explained that the GHS World Language teacher has requested permission to organize a summer 2013 trip to Spain for GHS students. The purpose of the trip is to provide an educational and cultural experience for the students that will reinforce and enhance their language abilities and cultural appreciation. He added that the high school principal was present to respond to any questions from the Board.
