## 2023-24 School Focus

We continue to stay focused on our four focuses with the goal of refining our action steps to meet these focuses. These are:

- 1. Science of Reading
- 2. Science of Writing/Handwriting
- 3. Math plan following Mary Buck's guidance
- 4. Social Emotional Learning with Conscious Discipline & DESSA

## Science of Reading

We continue to focus on students reading fluently by accurately reading text with 95% accuracy. To increase fluency, students are immersed in accurately reading the phonics patterns, accurately reading and saying sight words and rereading text multiple times.

## Math Plan

Mary Buck made a school visit to BES on 3/14/24. While at the school she worked with the principal and instructional coach to review the math implementation plan, prepare for the new state test for alignment and conducted walkthroughs to view math instruction.

Mary met with the second and third grade teams to provide support in teaching Eureka Math curriculum and meeting the grade level fluency requirements.

# Instructional Coaches Report by Arlene

We started out the month focusing on PDSA cycle 1 and 2. Teachers watched a video about Progress monitoring. Teachers logged in to Aimsweb to look at the individual monitoring form to see student growth on a trend line and understand the rate of improvement to meet the goal. Teachers related the PDSA documentation to Progress monitoring within Aimsweb.

We focused on math fluency in strengthening and building a strong foundation. That will in turn support students in developing a strong number sense to support problem solving. PD was given on the Math Rope which in turn is similar to the Reading Rope. The teachers filled out the Comprehensive Needs Assessment. This in turn will support the identification of the most important academic needs within our school. Any questions teachers had they were able to ask with support given from the SLT members. Teachers were also shown how to access and complete with the survey link.

We also continued to support teachers with coaching.
