Caitlyn once told me that she could never imagine teaching general education children. She loves the children she works with and watching them learn. She gets great pleasure out of hearing parents say, "I didn't think my child would ever be able to do that." She holds high expectations for her students both academically and behaviorally.

When you enter Caitlyn's room, students are actively engaged in work. The para-professionals that work in the room know what the expectations are for the students, they know student goals and they know the expectations Caitlyn has for them when working with the students. This creates a very positive feeling in the classroom.

Caitlyn knows which of her students like Buzz and Woody, who likes Tom and Jerry, who wants hot Cheetos or likes to work with Legos and most importantly who doesn't like the month of November because there are turkeys, but loves December because there are reindeer and Santa. The times I have been in her room for formal and informal observations there is continuous positive feedback for the students. It flows so naturally that she doesn't even realize it is happening.

Caitlyn has faced some very difficult challenges this year with student behaviors. She has not backed down from the challenge. District support personnel have come to the school to offer suggestions and support for the extreme behaviors that have been present with some of the students. Caitlyn has willingly accepted the suggestions and implemented them immediately. If the suggestions have not worked, she has reached out for more help. Caitlyn does not let anything stand in the way of her advocating for her students.

As many people know, there is a great deal of work that goes into the IEP's for students. She has learned quickly what has to be done and she has gotten it done. She keeps data for the students current and helps students see their progress.

Caitlyn is a team player. We have two Life Skills units at the school and she is never hesitant to step in when needed in situations that arise, even if it is with a student that is not assigned to her classroom. She keeps everyone laughing with her bright sense of humor and her ability to turn something hard into something positive. I know she has sat in her car at the end of the day and had thoughts of, "Do I really want to come back tomorrow?" but she tells herself that tomorrow is going to be better. She comes back the next day with a positive attitude and is ready to start over. Not only is Caitlyn a team player with students and employees in the Life Skills program she is a team player within the school. If she sees a student having difficulties in the hallway or on the playground she is ready and willing to help.
