



#### Elementary Total Students and Total Referrals






#### HMS Total Enrollment and Total Referrals





■ Total Percentage of Population By Subroup






#### HH9 Initiatives

- Staff participated in Illinois PBIS Network Tier 2 and Tier 3 training. Activities to implement.







**■** Total Percentage of Population By Subgroup






### HHS RtI/PBIS Pyramid




