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NKN DISTRICT UPDATE FOR INCLEMENT WEATHER DAY MAKEUP

Families, due to the three inclement weather days (12/9,10,11) the following changes will be made to the school district calendar:

<u>March 11</u> will now be a school day rather than a grade day.

March 17, second trimester ends

March 18, Grade day, non-school day

END OF YEAR ADDITIONS

<u>June 10,</u> Full day (8:35-2:35)

June 13, 14 student days (Full day)

<u>June 15,</u> last day for students, <u>NOT a late start,</u> school begins at 8:05 and early release @12:00 pm June 16, grade day K-12

The reason for the changes is to have a consistent number of student contact days for each trimester and to make up the three lost student contact days due to inclement weather. If there are additional inclement weather days later this year, additional changes to the calendar will be necessary. Sorry about the inconvenience; blame the weather!

MPORTANT

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR SCHOOL

<u>Senate Bill 895</u> is a NEW law about school immunizations exemptions for the 2015-2016 school year.

Religious exemptions signed prior to March 1, 2014, are no longer valid. Parents will be required to turn in documentation of immunization or complete the new process for a nonmedical exemption prior to Exclusion Day on February 17, 2016. For more information please go to

State law requires that all children in public and private schools, preschools, Head Start and certified child care facilities have up-to-date immunizations, or have a non-medical exemption. Parents or guardians will receive a final letter in late January or early February if their child's immunization record shows that he or she has not received the required vaccinations. **Parents are reminded that exclusion day is <u>February</u>, 18, 2016. Children will not be able to attend school if proper documentation is not received by the school office.**

NEHALEM ELEMENTARY WEEKEND BACK PACK PROGRAM

Filling the weekend food gap for local children in need

Over half of the children at Nehalem Elementary School qualify for free or reduced priced meals. Many of these children face hunger over weekends and school breaks. The Nehalem Elementary School Backpack Program is a new volunteer-based organization that provides food for local hungry children at times when other resources are not available, such as weekends and holidays.

Every Friday, volunteers provide the children who are enrolled in the program with a bag of food for the weekend. All of the food is child-friendly, nutritious, small and light enough to carry in a backpack, shelf-stable, and easy to prepare, even without a stove. These food resources will support the health, behavior, and achievement of every student that participates. The success in programs like this can be seen in positive changes in student attendance, behaviors, and grades. If you think your child could benefit from this program, please ask the front office for an enrollment form!

To donate in any dollar amount please make checks payable to Nehalem Elementary School Backpack Program, P.O. Box 190 Nehalem, OR 97131 or drop checks off directly at the Nehalem Elementary School office. \$20 provides food for one child for one month, \$200 provides food for one child for one school year. Our volunteers can separate bulk items into smaller servings. If you want to get something special for the kids, please do! We will include treats or toiletries (toothbrushes, toothpaste, etc).

GUIDELINES FROM OREGON DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR FAMILIES: STUDENTS SHOULD STAY HOME IF:

- Fever greater than 100.5 F (remain at home until temperature is normal for 24 hours without a fever reducer medicine)
- Vomiting (remain at home until there is no vomiting for 24 hours)
- Stiff neck or headache with fever
- ANY rash with or without fever (until licensed medical professional has cleared to return to school)
- Unusual behavior change, such as irritability, lethargy, or somnolence (sleepy, drowsy)
- Jaundice (yellow color or skin or eyes)
- Diarrhea (3 watery or loose stools in one day with or without fever) (remain at home until there is no diarrhea for 24 hours)
- Skin lesions that are "weepy" (fluid or pus-filled)
- Colored drainage from eyes
- Brown/green drainage from nose with fever of greater than 100.5 F
- Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath; serious, sustained cough
- Symptoms or complaints that prevent the student from participating in his/her usual school activities, such as persistent cough, with or without presence of fever
- Student requires more care than the school staff can safely provide

Only a licensed health care provider can determine a diagnosis and/or prescribe treatment and provide instructions regarding the student's return to school.

Students needing to go home due to illness will wait in the health room for pickup.

SWIMMING POOL BUILT IN 1930...... SCHOOL SWIM BEGINS!!

Gray 368-6238 It's Pool-a-thon time again and hard to believe it's our 26th annual fundraiser! The proceeds from the NCRD Pool-a-thon support the NCRD/ Nehalem Elementary School Swim & Water Safety Awareness Program which has existed in some form since 1930! At that time the school district was planning an addition to the school in Nehalem. The drowning of two local teenage boys prompted the community to ask the school district to add a natatorium. Even though it was during the great depression, there was overwhelming community support to teach every child how to swim to avoid future tragedies. 85 years later in this area surrounded by water & dominated by water related recreation, we continue to accomplish our mission of providing Swim Instruction & Water Safety to all Nehalem Elementary Students. The goal has been to offer a safe environment where the students can learn to swim, & be educated in water safety, while instilling the value

of swimming as a lifetime skill and healthy recreational activity. The skills they learn in the pool could save their life or the life of another. The NCRD School Swim Program reaches out to every Nehalem Elementary Student Kindergarten through fifth Grade. This also includes the NKN District #56 adaptive Swim Program. Historically our community has accomplished something extraordinary in financially sponsoring students who are swimming laps for dollars during pool-a-thon. By pledging money or making a donation to a student swimmer, you can help guarantee all the children will continue to benefit from this vital and historic program. We each can play an important role in maintaining our community's essential values, and your generous investment in the Swim Program will make a direct and immediate impact.

Participating kids will be canvassing throughout the community January 22nd thru February 27th looking for sponsors who will pledge dollars for their swimming efforts.
