    Serravallo (waiting on approval from Mr. Donahue)
- Research STEM Lab
  - Set up a tour with Taylorville Jr High and H.S. to see STEM Lab
  - Researching information on funding for a STEM Lab or a Makers Room
- PTO fundraiser money was spent on a Chromebook cart with the 32 additional devices we are now at a 2:1 ratio of students to Chromebooks. Each pair of teachers share one class set.
  - Working on raising funds for 2 more carts so that a pair of teachers will have a cart at their access to share.
  - Chromebook familiarity will help with the technical mechanics of maneuvering the PARCC Assessment
