A. Examples: Set limits on TV watching, checking in with kids when parents are not home, arranging after-school activities and supervised care

These are just a couple of things parents can do at home to get involved with their child's education.

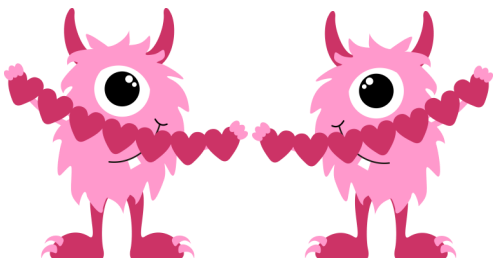
