School Board Report-January 2019



Current Enrollment:

151 Students: 48 Freshmen, 35 Sophomores, 38 Juniors, and 30 Seniors. (no change)

Attendance for the semester: 94.45%, Freshman-95.45% Sophomores-96.37%, Juniors-92.70%, Seniors-92,93%. We had 2 seniors with chronic absences, missed 4-6 weeks, no longer enrolled.

Saturday School attendance: December 1st = 11 December 15th = 19

Students with 9 or more absences went before the Attendance committee, December 21st. Students were assigned additional days of Saturday School in order to receive credit for the 1st semester. Those dates are January 12th, 19th, 26th and February 2nd.

We had 21 cell phones picked up this semester: \$210 towards our "communication" scholarship fund.

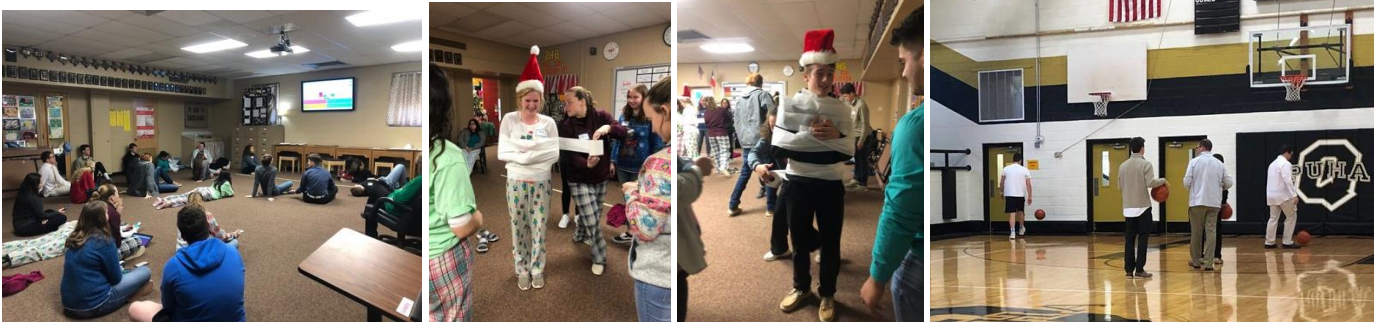

During this presentation, students learned about the difference between problems and challenges, and how everyone experiences pressure based on acceptance. We had activities that put students with others they might not normally interact with. Students were able to share what causes them stress and ways they can be positive toward others. After the presentation students met with their Tribe to continue the conversations. Each staff member was assigned a “Tribe” of 6-8 students in August. We revised our groups and redefined the purpose. Tribes will now meet on the first Friday of each month.
