

# A History of BARR

1998-1999: BARR method developed at St. Louis Park High School

2017-2018: Stillwater Area High School (grade 9)

2019-2020: Stillwater Area High School (grade 10)

2019-2020: Lake Elmo Elementary (1st elementary school in nation)

**2021-2022:** Afton-Lakeland Elementary

2023-2024: Brookview Elementary; Oak-Land Middle








### **BARR:**


- Focuses on students' strengths
- Discusses the needs of ALL students (equity minded)
- Uses data as a guide to supports students' needs
- Builds relationships
  - Teachers work together to support both current and former students
- Families are an integral part of the BARR program






# Relationships + Data

Staff look at data to determine a "Level of Concern" in both Academic and Social/Emotional Skills for each student.

- 0 Thriving
- 1 Brief Intervention Students
- 2 Team Intervention Students
- 3 Risk Review Students





### **Conversations About Students**

### **BEFORE BARR**

- Conversations in the hallway, copy room, etc.
- Teacher-centered conversations (This is hard on me...)
- Fearful: expressing helplessness
- No clear solutions generated

### **AFTER BARR**

- Specific time dedicated to conversations
- Student-centered
- Strength-based and student goal focused
- Improved system of student support
- Solutions focused



# MTSS/BARR Alignment


### **Multi-Tiered Systems of Supports (MTSS)**

- MTSS is a systemic, continuous improvement framework for ensuring positive social, emotional, behavioral, developmental and academic outcomes for every student.
- Evidence-based practices and relies on the understanding and belief that every student can learn and thrive.
- Data-Based Decision Making
- Family/Community Engagement
- Assessment







# Highlights from Year 1 (2023-2024)

### Oak-Land Middle School and Brookview Elementary

- Positive professional development
- Staff are talking differently about students (asset-based conversations)
- Equity Committee looking at needs of ALL students
- Students are building positive relationships with one another, which helps to reduce conflict
  - Reduction in behavioral referrals
- I-Time and U-Time lessons implemented

# **BARR Highlights**

- Stillwater Area High School saw a decline in 9th grade failure rates from 14% to 6.5% in its first year of implementation.
  - The number of failures for 9th graders dropped to less than 2% just before
     COVID and has stayed below 7% since that time.
- From 2019 to 2023, MCA scores at Lake Elmo Elementary in both math and reading for grades 3-5 increased by eight percentile points.
- While overall MCA reading scores have been on the decline in our district, both Lake Elmo and Afton-Lakeland elementary schools saw an increase in proficiency for 2023.



# Who Supports BARR?

### **Elementary**

Team of staff work together to support implementation

### **Middle School**

### New in 2024-2025:

1.0 FTE BARR coordinator at each building

### **High School**

1.0 FTE BARR coordinator



# **Funding BARR**

### **Program costs:**

- 3 year commitment
- \$80,000 annually per building
  - Includes coaching, U-Time lessons, professional development, networking

### **Funding sources to date:**

- Private grants
- MN Department of Education grants (2023-2024): Oak-Land and Brookview
- Non-exclusionary discipline (NED) Grant (2023-2024):
   Stillwater Middle
- MTSS grant



### Future of BARR

Aim of Pony Plan is to implement BARR districtwide

- Adding Stillwater Middle in 2024-2025
- As budget allows, will fund remaining elementary schools
  - Andersen; Lily Lake; Rutherford; Stonebridge
