Parent Involvement

This will be for better documentation purposes moving forward.

- Update on fundraising goals from last year was to work towards a new playground for the school. An estimate provided to use from Playcraft was approximately \$200,000 for the entire playground and new mats. We have decided to do it in stages, which Playcraft contact has assured us is something that is commonly done. Given the money raised last year, we will be replacing the octagon structure as the current one has caused numerous head injuries since school started. This cost will be about \$14,000. No mats for now due to this requires a concrete curb to be placed which would increase the cost quite a bit. ADA compliant swings deferred for now due to accessibility and higher cost. May consider putting wood chips under the octagon, and will look into cost.
