Go On Grant 2014-2015

The Albertson's foundation has awarded another \$40,000 dollars to Homedale High School this year through the Go ON grant. Debbie Flaming will be the coordinator over the Go On grant again this year. Debbie and her Go On team have put together an incredible agenda of programs and innovative ideas that she and her team will make happen at Homedale High School this school year. I have included the Go On Vision for Homedale High School below:

At Homedale High School, we have been inspired by the dual credit program at New Plymouth and would like to pursue donors from the community and utilize state programs such as 8 in 6 and Fast Forward, the CACG grant and dual credit scholarships offered by the colleges and universities. Also we would like to support the teachers at the high school who are becoming dual credit instructors. We are working with our district data director to track dual credit classes more efficient and effectively. With the Go On grant, our vision is to lead the way in providing innovative learning opportunities for students; academic excellence and high expectations for all students by providing support, resources, training and technology.

- 1. Homedale High School will track ACT benchmark scores as well as PSAT, SAT and Compass Scores. We have the Gear Up program which offers support for the ACT.
- 2. Homedale High School will track students have completed a job shadow. During the past two years of our Go On sponsored senior project classes, we discovered that job

shadowing was one of the biggest impact areas for our students in their decisions about their post-secondary plans. We have built this component into all senior projects.

Basic Funding for Homedale High School includes the following:

- **2-** Host a FAFSA completion event for both parents and students. (Get Ready Week February 9-13)
- **3-** Support effective use of the Idaho Career Information System (CIS).

- **4-** Support effective use of student Go On Ambassadors. Promote monthly Go On activities
 - Provide mentoring/leadership training for Go On Ambassadors.
 - Freshmen paired with Go On Ambassador/mentor) Monthly Activities:
- **5-** Pay for juniors to attend the college fair.
 - (National College Fair in Boise)
- **6-** Pay for juniors and seniors to make college visits. (Transportation)
- **7-** *Promote the 4 Go On Weeks.* (Promotion/ Swag/ Guest Speakers)

Go On: Senior Project Instructor

- Develop and enhance senior project curriculum so that college and career planning is the focus.
- Promote ACT preparation and registration for seniors in the fall insuring all seniors who receive a fee waiver for the ACT and take advantage of the opportunity to take the test a second time to improve score and increase college admission probability.

- Promote community senior project awareness campaign.
- Promote community senior project support through scholarship fund.

Academic Support: Curriculum and Technology

- Pay stipends for curriculum writing to integrate college and career preparation into academic courses as well as the senior project class.
- Purchase academic support resources and materials for teachers promoting college and career readiness and professional technical education.

Sources of Strength coming to Homedale High School on Oct 23rd and November 7th

Sources of Strength is a best practice youth suicide prevention project that utilizes the power of peer social networks to change unhealthy norms and culture and ultimately prevent suicide, bullying and substance abuse. The program is designed to prevent suicide by increasing help seeking behaviors and connections between peers and caring adults with a focus on Hope, Help, and Strength. Sources of Strength takes a different approach in youth suicide prevention by moving beyond a singular focus on risk factors through building multiple sources of support around young individuals so that when times get hard they have strengths to rely on.

Sources of Strength Core Principals:

- Train both peer leaders and adults one without the other lacks prevention power
- Use peer leaders to break down codes of silence and increase peer help seeking
- Core emphasis on strengths that move beyond a singular focus on risk and suicide warnings
- Multiple sources of support are encouraged including but moving beyond a singular focus on mental health referrals
- Hope, Help, and Strength messages delivered by peer leaders using local faces and voices

On October 23rd Bethany Updike, Cameron Wiemerslage, Casey Grove, Janee Brumfield, Jennifer Levinski, Karla Haylett, Katy Belanger, Lisa Isla, Matt Holtry, Becky Emery will participate in a four hour training during the morning and then during the afternoon will join 25 students and be trained together for another four hours.

On Friday Nov. 7^{th} Sources of Strength will come to Homedale High School and will train the entire HS staff for 90 minutes.

Homedale High School will participate in the Strive Program for the 2014-15 School Year

Our school was selected to pilot the Strive program for the Albertson's Foundation during the 2013-14 school year. Because of this we have plans to offer the program to HHS students for the new school year.

How Does Strive Work?

Homedale High School students are paired up with a Boise State University honor students. The college student then serves as a mentor to the high school senior or junior to help them walk through the challenging process of preparing for college. Due to Homedale's remote location, the students meet via I-Pads or I-Phones supervised by high school teachers during specific times each week. Participating high school students had the opportunity to meet for organized activities three times during the fall semester at Boise State University. In the fall semester, seniors participated in the program. During the spring semester, juniors participated in the program. Two visits were planned and the mentors and mentees had the opportunity to get together. The high school students were given a tour of the Boise State University campus.

Strive students will be traveling to BSU on **October 11**th to get matched up with their mentors and receive training for the STRIVE experience.

Gear Up Coordinator & Senior Project Instructor

Janee Brumfield will again be the coordinator over the Gear Up grant and will also be the instructor for our senior project classes. Gear up pays for and organizes college visitations for our students to TVCC, WSI, College of Idaho, Northwest Nazarene University and Boise State University. Janee Brumfield and Debbie Flaming sometimes combine the Gear Up grant and the Go On grant when they are doing projects for the HS, they work as a collaborative team to make a positive difference at Homedale High School.

Homedale High School Student Council

On October 13th, Six ASB officers, Mr. Weimerslage, and I will be attending the Idaho Student Council Conference at the Nampa Civic Center. The goal will be to come back from this conference with more direction and ideas to help improve the overall leadership experience and involvement of the Homedale High School student council.

Homedale High School SRO

The Partnership between Homedale City Police Department and Homedale High School has been great this school year. Mike McFetridge has assisted the HS in Fire Drills, as well as a

Drug Dog walk thru on September 24th, which turned up no drugs or drug paraphernalia. Officer McFetridge has also assisted in many behavior issues at the HS, having officer McFetridge at the HS has made a very positive difference.

9/11 and Veterans Day Assembly

Bailey Adams, a senior at Homedale High School this year is doing her senior project around September 11th and Veterans Day.
