### **Curriculum and Instruction**

### **PEAK Testing**

In early April students in grade 9 will be taking the Performance Evaluation for Alaska's Schools in the areas of language arts and math. Students in grade 10 will be taking the science PEAKS test. We encourage students to get plenty of rest and to do their best on the tests. These results provide data to schools, help to evaluate equity in education, and provide a snapshot on how Alaska's schools are doing. For students not testing, these will be regular instructional days.

### In-School SAT/ASVAB Testing

Ms. Riedel offered an in-school SAT on Wednesday, March 3rd. We had around 20 students participate. This will be the last SAT offered in Craig this year. We also offered the ASVAB test on March 10<sup>th</sup> and had six of our students participate. Two proctors came to administer the test and then spent time with our students going over their results. Our students appreciated the opportunity to discuss those results and to learn more about themselves and their areas of strength.

### Voyages & Six-Pack Course

Four of our CHS students were able to participate in the Six-Pack course offered at the Vocational Center February 25<sup>th</sup>-March 6<sup>th</sup>. This was an excellent opportunity and all of the students passed the testing portions of the course. CHS also held some mini-voyages during this time. Students had some choices to participate in drama, knitting, wood-burning, wood shop, welding, board games, yoga/dance and technology exploration. This was a time for students and teachers to connect and strengthen social and emotional connections, which is especially important in light of the current pandemic we have been dealing with.

### **Inservice Days**

On March 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup>, CCSD staff participated in two in-service days. Staff received

training on strategies to assist students in accessing text and increasing engagement and learning. Our special education staff was provided training on the Powerschool platform as we transition to using that system for the special education program. Teachers also had time to work on their various curricular areas, strengthening their current units or making updates as new materials have been onboarded.

### Academic Decathlon Virtual State Meet

The Academic Decathlon team persevered and came home with a first in their division, and quite a bit of hardware as well. To say they had to overcome adversity might be an understatement. First off, the entire meet was virtual this year. Secondly, school was unexpectedly shut down the second day of their state meet, so they had to continue on from home. Despite all of this, they had many successes for such a young team. The team took first in their division, competing against Bering Strait and Point Hope, each with two teams.
