Literature: This measures students' ability to recount fictional stories including characters, settings, and plot.			
Informational: This measures students' ability to determine the main idea and key details of a nonfiction text.

Fluency (T2 and T3 only): This measures students' ability to read grade level text with sufficient accuracy and fluency.			
Phonics: This measures students' ability to recognize grade-level letter-sound relationships and word analysis skills in decoding words when reading and writing.			
Word Recognition: This measures students' ability to recognize high frequency words.

Number and Operations in Base Ten: Use place value understanding and properties of operation to perform multi digit arithmetic.			
Operations and Algebraic Thinking (T3 only): Solve problems involving addition, subtraction, multiplication, and/or division and identify and explain patterns in arithmetic.
