Mitigation Strategies for In-Person Learning Opportunities

- Wear a mask

Action Steps led by Site and District **Coordinators** When Cases Occur



Identify

Isolate

Report

- 1. Follow screening procedures for students and staff
- 2. Identify possible cases of COVID-19



- 1. Isolate the individual if in the school building
- 2. Provide direction to the individual and/or family for when it will be safe for the individual to return based on public health quidelines



- 1. Report cases of COVID-19 to District COVID-19 Coordinators
- 2. Report positive test cases of COVID-19 to the MN Department of Health



- 1. Interview individual and review schedule to identify potential close contacts
- 2. Trace who has been in close contact with the individual

contact of the need to guarantine for 14 days

Trace



- 1. Communicate to the school community via email there has been a positive test case
- 2. Communicate via phone call to those individuals/families who have been in close

Communicate



- 1. Close impacted space for up to 24 hours and identify temporary alternative space
- 2. Clean and disinfect space impacted

Transportation

- Parents notified August 20
 - O Bus stop & times
- Bus routes are established
 - o 50% capacity maintained
- All bus riders will wear a face covering
- Buses will be cleaned between routes





Temperature Screening

- Temperature check monitors are installed and available at each site
- Temperature screening procedure is in place
- Nurses have worked with Principals to identify isolation areas within each building









Nutrition Services



- All students will have access to school breakfast and lunch
- Parents will receive a weekly survey
 - a. Also available on the website
 - b. Meals are bundled for purchase
- In-Person students will eat mainly in the cafeteria
- Students will experience contactless meal pickup
 - a. Staff will serve/package food
 - b. Hand held scanners will be used by cashiers


Making a Decision: Goals

14-day county level case rate







Selecting a learning model for school opening




Number of cases per 10,000 over 14 days, by county of residence	Learning model

20-29	Hybrid learning for all students
30-49	Hybrid learning for elementary students; distance learning for secondary students
50+	Distance learning for all students
