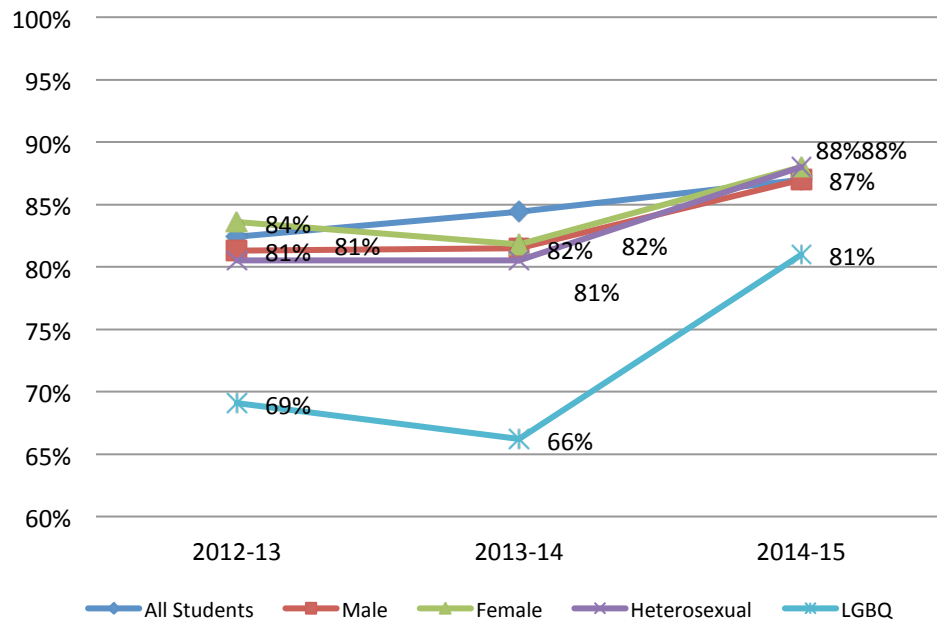

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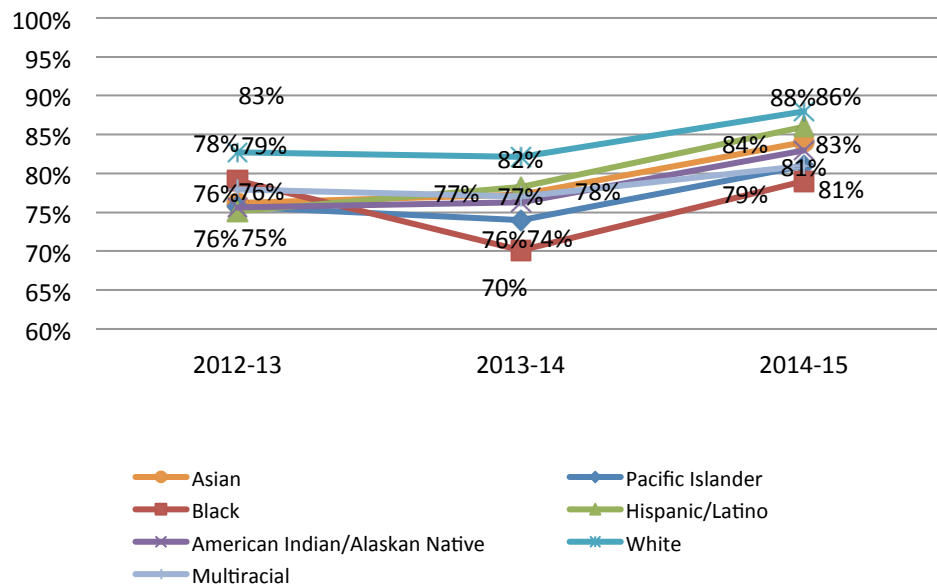

Analysis

Successes:

- Implementation of AVID elective classes at 9th grade and 8th grade at all secondary schools. In these classes the student to teacher relationship was improved.
- The use of Early Warning System (EWS) has helped develop system-wide interventions at the high school level.
- The use of the EWS developed by our District's IT Department was successfully used by secondary schools to identify attendance concerns of students at the high school level.
- The percent of students reporting that at least one adult in school really cares about them increased in all reporting categories, of which some have a significant increase, such as LGBTQ.
- A focus this year by many schools on the 5D+ framework in the dimension of Classroom Climate and Culture. All teachers have received targeted feedback on this dimension.

Issues:

- The use of the EWS is not consistent at secondary schools as a tool to enhance student to staff relationships. A system for intervening with a student based on the EWS data has not been developed.
- Lack of staff who reflect the diversity of student demographics.
- No system for reporting and accountability for students attending the former in-district GED and PCC Links Program.

Action Plan

This year:

- Continue with the Early Warning System.
- Continue the expansion of AVID.
- Continue with training and supports for administrators to coach teachers on building their classroom climate and culture using the 5D+ Framework.

Long-term:

- Implementation of AVID elective class at all grade levels at secondary schools will increase the number of students reporting they have an adult who cares about them.
- Continued support for teachers in creating a positive classroom climate and culture.

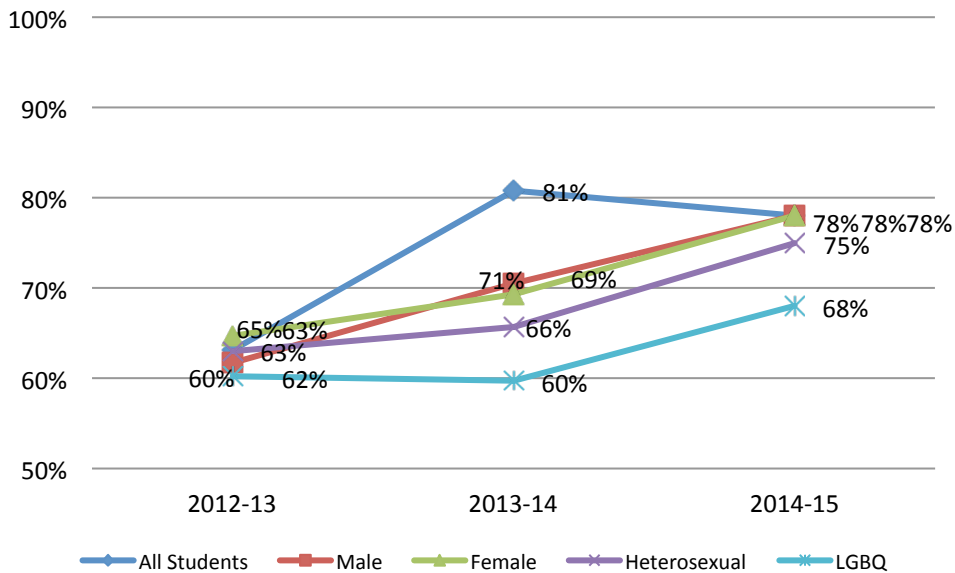

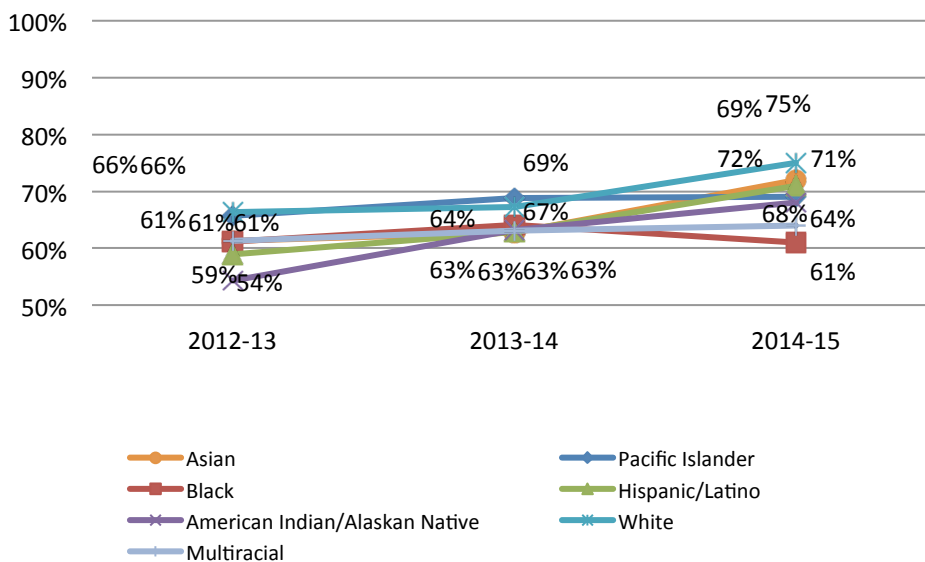

Analysis

Successes:

- Males, Females, Heterosexual, and LGBTQ students reported increased percentages in adults helping with decision making.
- The work of the Outreach Specialist increased the number returning to school that had left school.

Issues:

- Lack of staff who reflect the diversity of student demographics.
- Overall, larger class sizes at the secondary level compared to the elementary level.

Action Plan

This year:

- Increase in counseling position to full time at the elementary level and the addition of Career and College Ready counselors to one at each level.
- Increase in AVID Elective participants.

Long-term:

- Implementation of 6th grade and 11th grade AVID elective classes at all secondary schools to increase student support with decision-making.

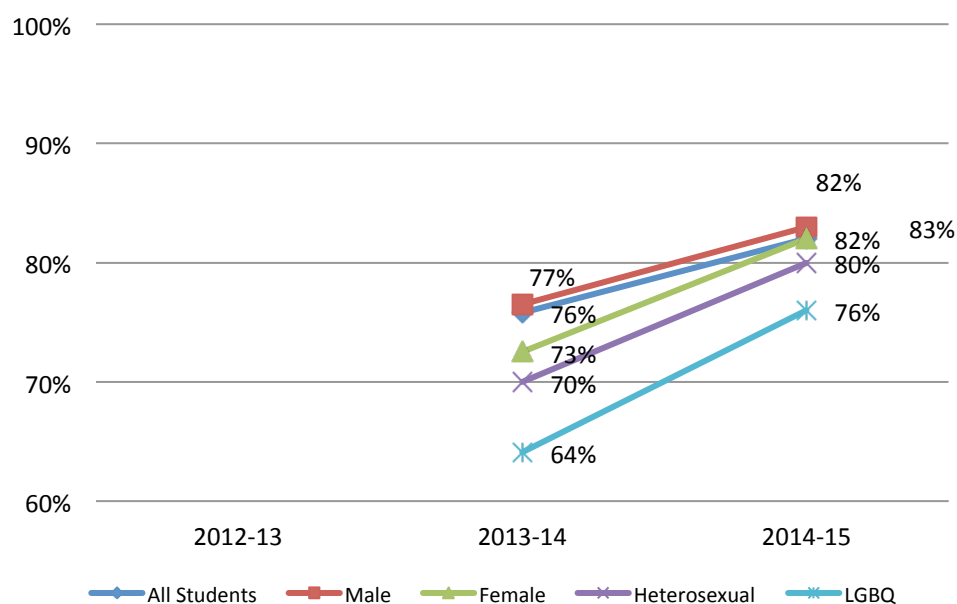

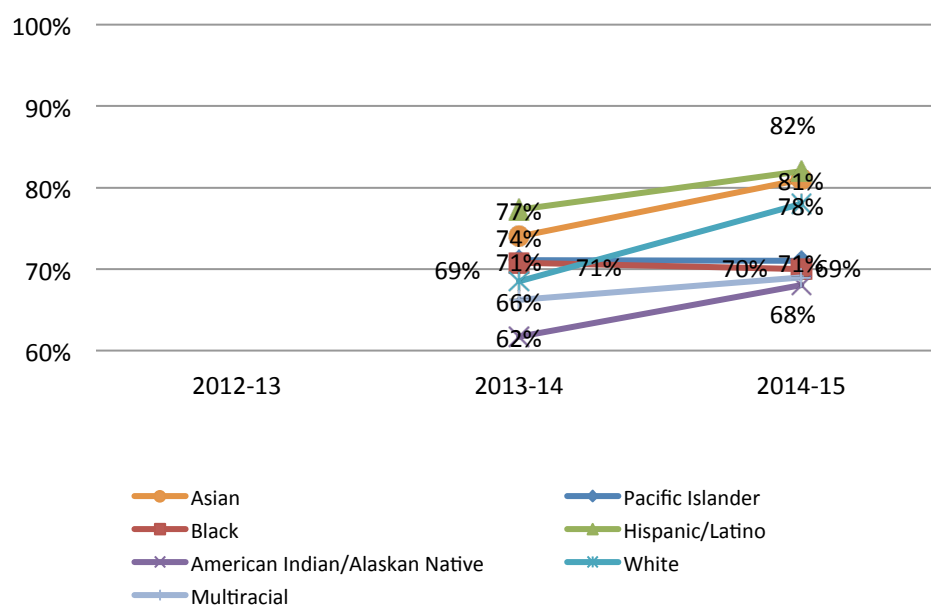

Analysis

Successes:

- The use of a standards based learning system supports teachers' feedback to improve student achievement.
- The use of the standards based learning system allows teachers to provide targeted feedback to individual students based on their progress toward individual goals.
- All teachers have received individualized feedback from administrators in the dimension of assessment on the 5D+ Framework.
- Percent of students reporting receiving feedback increased in every student group category.

Issues:

- Continued professional development to support new teachers and teachers who need updated training.

Action Plan

This year:

- Continued assessment literacy training.
- Continued training and support to principals on implementing the 5D+ framework.
- Additional professional development on formative assessment training should be provided to new teachers and teachers who request additional training.
- Continued staff development on assessment literacy for staff at all levels.

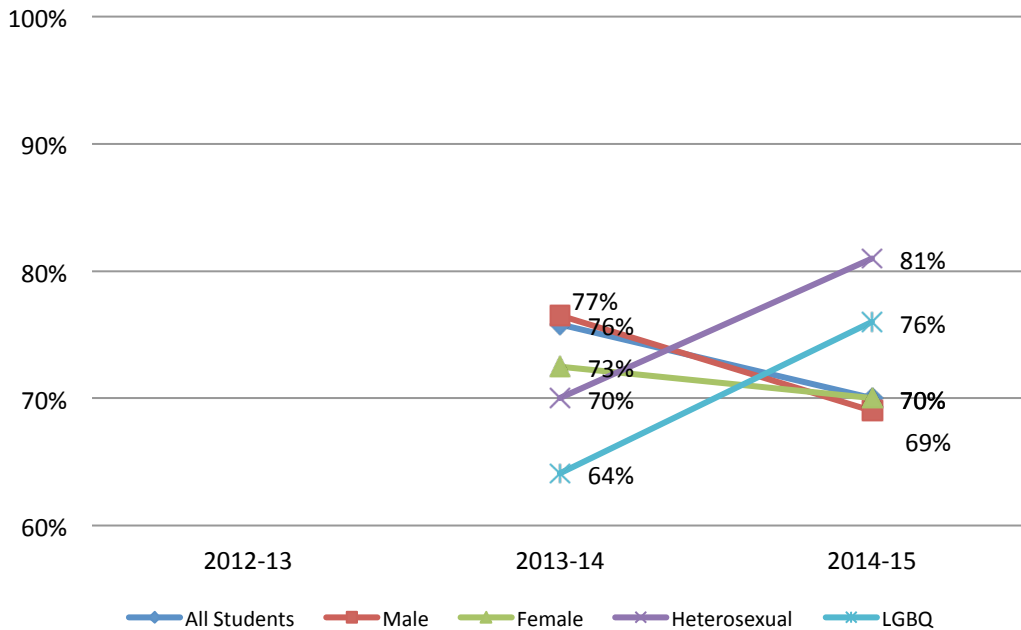

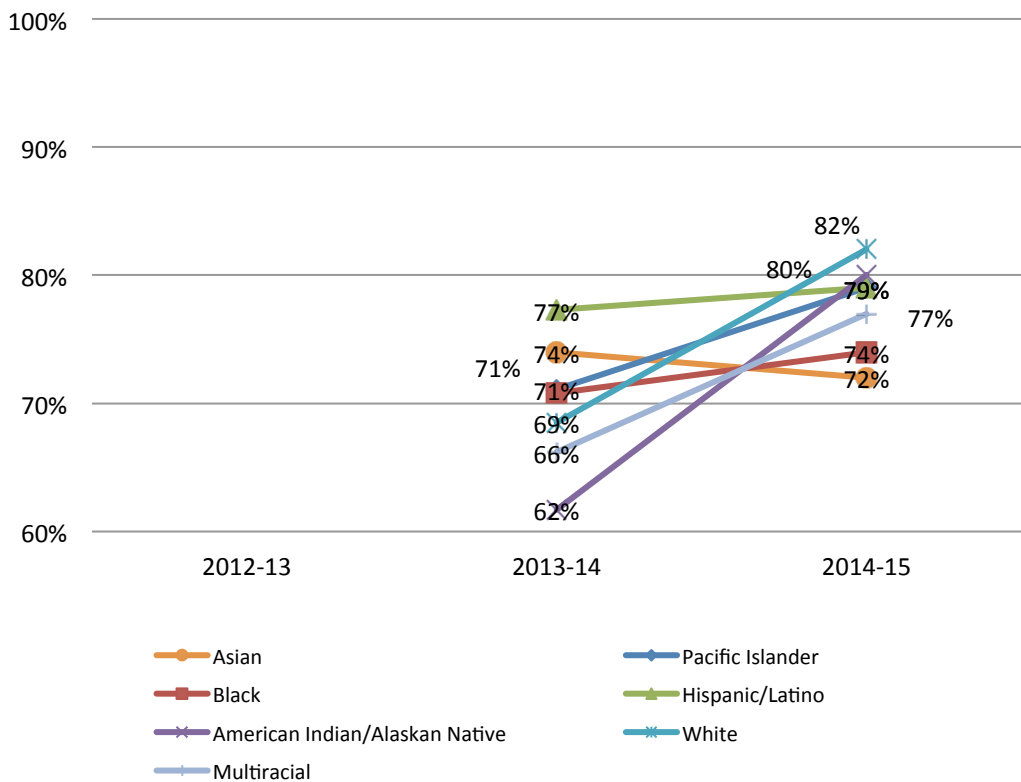

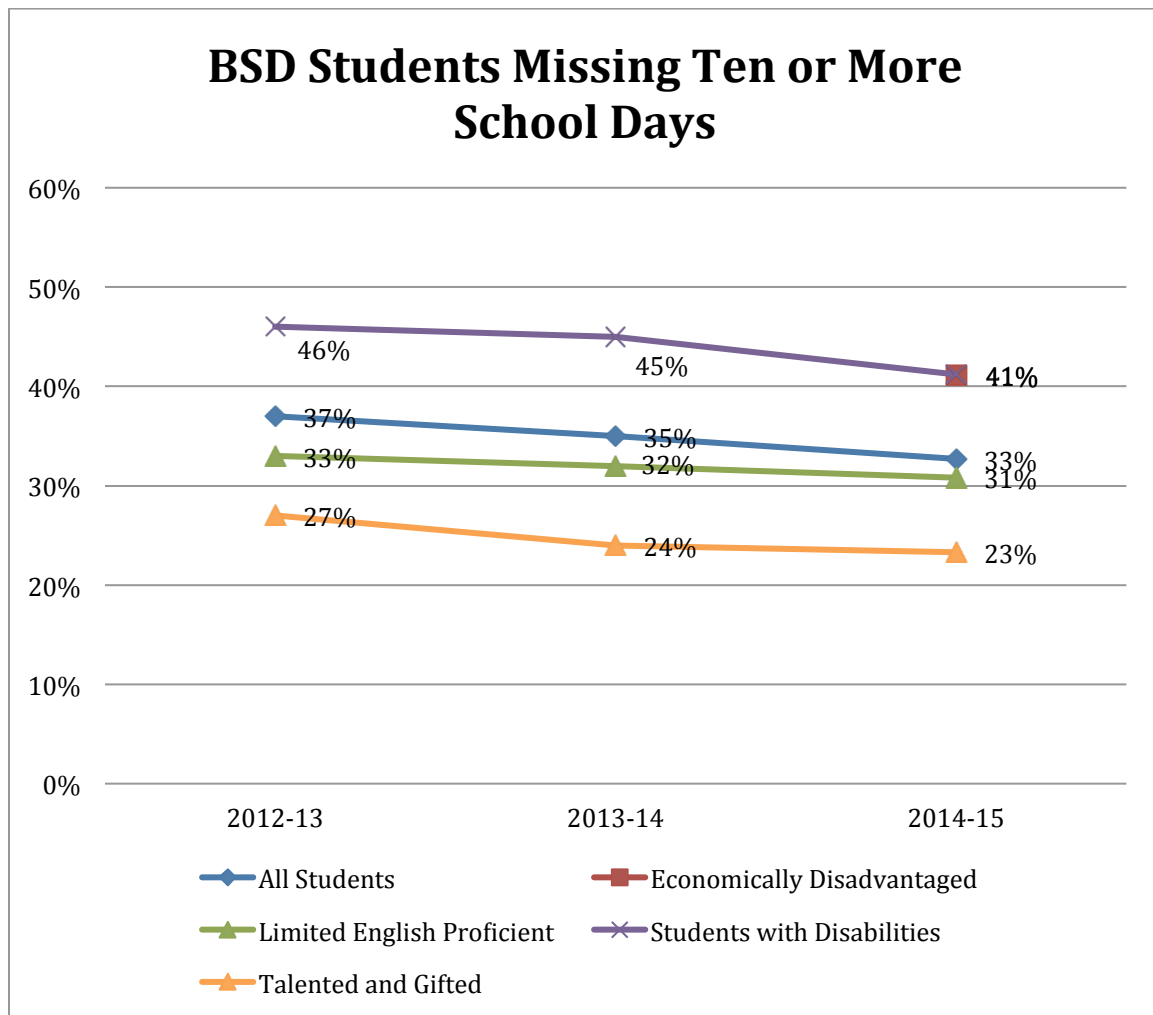
This year:

- Continued support for PYP increased implementation at elementary level.

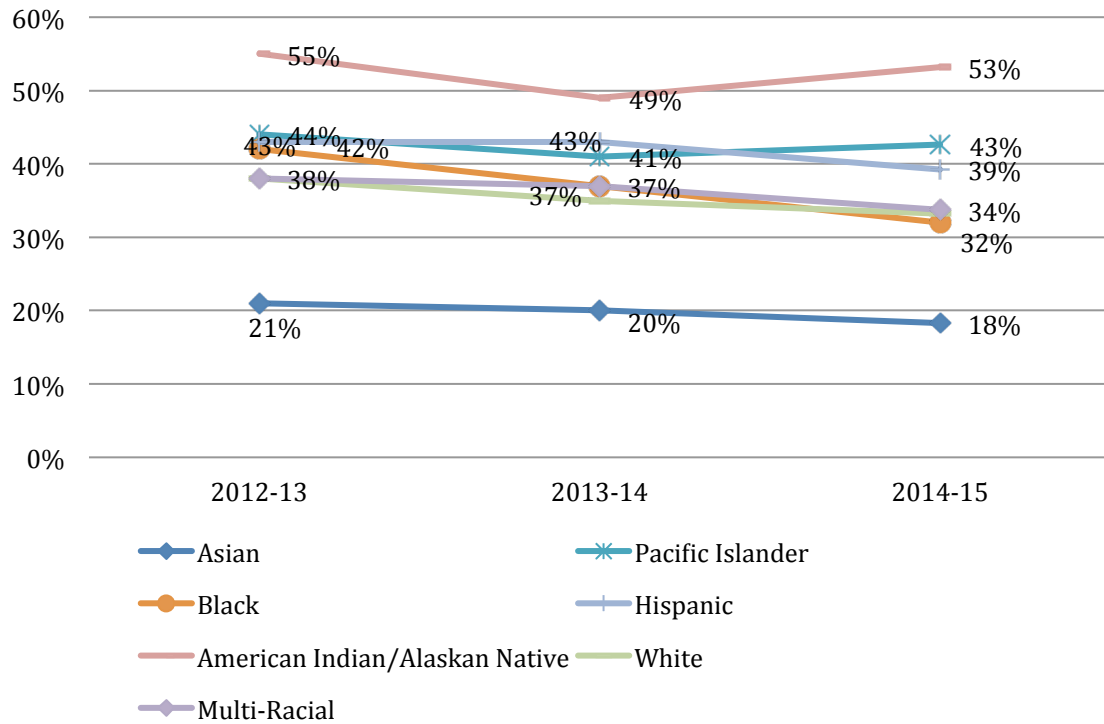
Long term:

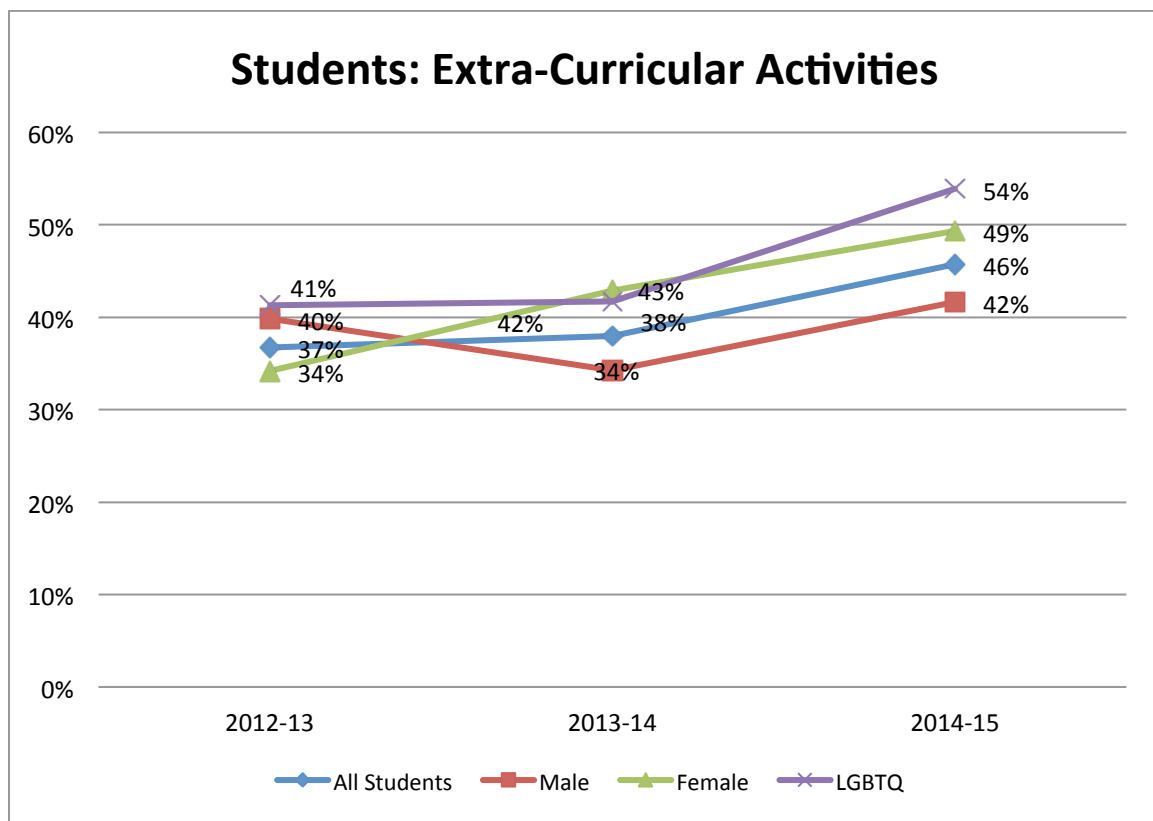

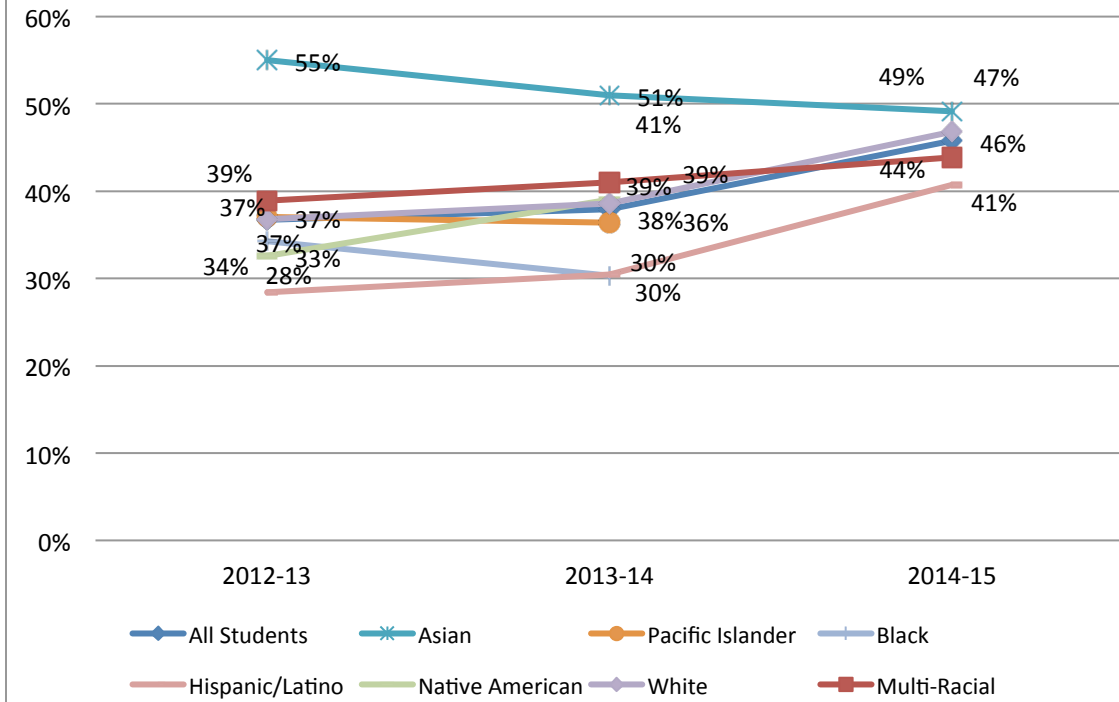
