







Why AVID?





The AVID College and Career Readiness Framework



AVID Leadership: District Director



- Responsible for ensuring the implementation of AVID components according to methodologies, and for facilitating the development of site conditions that ensure effective AVID implementation and retention
- Greatly influences the effectiveness of AVID implementation
- Acts as a liaison between the district and AVID Center
- Is strong in three areas:
 - Alignment
 - Continuous Improvement
 - Professional Learning

AVID Leadership: Site Teams



Principal

- Acts as a liaison with district administration
- Participates in AVID Site Team
- Supports the AVID Site Coordinator
- Communicates and encourages support for AVID teachers, parents, and the community

AVID Site Coordinator

- Strong student advocate who is committed to the philosophy of AVID
- Leads the building of an active, participatory AVID Site Team
- Advocates and provides professional learning regarding AVID methodologies for other staff members of the school and district

AVID Site Team Members

• Includes AVID Counselor, AVID teachers, and content teachers

AVID Elective – 2024-2025 School Year

Course offering for grade 9 and 10 students

AVID Elective is...

- AVID is for students who have the potential for honors, advanced, or AP work in school but need support paired with the rigor
- AVID combines rigor with support that includes their own individual determination and the support of teachers, other AVID students, family members, AVID teachers, and tutors

AVID Elective is **not**...

- AVID is not an 'at-risk' system.
- AVID is not for students who fail to complete any homework or consistently receive D's or F's
- AVID is not for unmotivated students...they must have individual determination

Considerations for AVID Elective student include...

- Is proficient or close to proficient on assessments
- Hard worker, positive attitude, and collaborative
- Has potential, but may have special circumstances that could be obstacles to achievement

What is the AVID Elective?

Credit bearing year-long course

For one period a day, students receive the additional academic, social, and emotional support that will help them succeed in their school's most rigorous courses.

Students are taught academic vocabulary, using critical thinking skills, engaging in collaborative tutorials, attending college field trips, listening to guest speakers, taking Cornell notes, and implementing various WICOR (Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, and Reading) strategies.


