Sam Boardman Elementary

December is a superb month for Sam Boardman Elementary.

Finally, the second week of December was the staff celebration of the season. Different teams took different days of the week and provided a meal for the group. It was so good to see staff working together and enjoying each other's company. We are looking forward to the break, and coming back well-rested and ready to tackle the second part of the year!

Windy River Elementary

Technology continues to be a vital part of the education process. At the beginning of the year our school was awarded 102 chrome books through our local district grant. Our desire as a school was to procure enough electronic devices to allow students to have a one-one ratio with any given device. Recently, Windy River was able to purchase 40 additional chrome books which brought us to this goal. Students in every grade level have the opportunity to either have a chrome book, iPad or desktop computer.

Student Achievement is a second component of our "4 Square Focus". With the help of these electronic devices our goal is to develop a math program which combines our new math assessment with a computer based program, to improve student achievement. At the beginning of the year each student was given a benchmark test. Every 6 weeks' students are re-evaluated to see how they are progressing. Our electronic devices are allowing us to take the data from these assessments and use them in a computer-based program that will generate specific math problems based on the needs of the students.

We are finding out that with technology comes patience and understanding. The first week of implementation has been rocky, but teachers are working through the hiccups to help their students succeed.

Riverside Jr/Sr High School

November and December continue to be busy months at Riverside. The first of November Mrs. Rosen organized a College Application week where we had a variety of community and regional volunteers come in to help our seniors with college applications, essays, and scholarships. We already have 33 seniors that have completed the application process to at least one college. The Juniors have also met with Chris Elliot to review their results from the career inventory/ASVAB scores. This information will be used in their advisory and Language Arts classes as students work on their 10 year plans and research career opportunities.

November was also our first parent-teacher conference for the year, we have moved to two day conferences at the middle of the semester. Despite having the highest parent turn out in 6 years, their feedback on the changes are mixed and we are reviewing different strategies to address concerns and hopefully get more parents involved.

Our staff are continuing to take advantage of multiple professional development opportunities to improve their content instruction and the culture of the school. We have two math teachers participating in a STEM grant that is providing instructional and real life application professional development. Oregon GEAR UP is also sponsoring two sessions of professional development around the topic of social emotional learning and growth mindset. Staff completed the first session the first of December and several will have the opportunity to walk in the shoes of a student for a day and bring their experiences back to the group during our second training. In January we will be hosting a teacher workshop for the KidWind Project which will be held at RHS in March.

Winter sports are now in full swing with all teams having started competition. Both basketball teams won their opening games and our wrestlers are starting off strong.

AC Houghton Elementary

At AC Houghton we are gearing up for the holiday season. The students are working hard practicing for our holiday concerts on December 8th (k/1) and 13th (2/3) at 6:30 pm. The students are collecting canned food to share with others in our community who may need some extra help this holiday season. On Dec. 4th our staff and students will participate in the annual Irrigon tree lighting ceremony at Irrigon City Park at 5:00 pm. We are looking forward to the break to be ready to come back and start after school programs, and many more learning opportunities for our students. The sounds of Christmas are ringing throughout the building and town.

Irrigon Elementary School is preparing for our final sled run before Christmas break. This includes our Winter Music Concert and Lego League Competition.

Radon testing took place the end of October in all schools by PBS Environmental. We recently received our Radon report and all levels were below the EPA limits in all schools. Jan has the test results on file at her office for review. Results will be published on the MCSD website.

The District plans to evaluate our camera systems for front entrances in all buildings for security purposes. We will be working with the IMESD IT Department to go out for bid for this project. Additionally, we are currently reviewing campus site locations of existing AED machines and plan to add additional units to help provide better coverage for each MCSD campus.
