Prepare for three school models of Distance Learning, In-Person, Hybrid.


Fall: Contingency Learning Plans (CLPs).

CLP's outlined special education services for all three models.

Spring: Summer programming for all SWDs (Students with Disabilities)

Offered Summer Blast (Targeted Services) to every student with an Individualized Education Plan (IEP).

Providing Special Education Recovery Services



When?

Services can be provided **before school, during the school day, after school, or during the summer or any other break.**



Who?

Services will predominantly be provided by a special education licensed staff member.

Results

Full IEP Meetings - 495 meetings before December 1st. 2021

IEP Decision Making for Services to Address COVID-19 Impact - 62 determinations for recovery services were made

Examples of Recovery Services:

- **Additional related service sessions (OT, Speech...)**
- **Additional academic direct service (Reading, Math)**
- **Add Social Work services**
- **Determinations for ESY**
- **Credit Recovery**
