MaryKay shared that perhaps we could put the camera(s) at knee level, ground level, or over 6 feet? Or have a night vision camera? This will be tabled for the future.

E. Nature Journaling -- digital entry ideas?
Emily shared the nature journal entries that she put into Advisory (Great job, Emily:) and Becky reported most of her students are doing great with their electronic nature journals. Clare reported <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> of the middle school are fully engaged with their nature journaling.

  - MaryKay shared her excitement to work with our committee and to teach environmental studies. She shared about her past opportunity to teach MN Ecology.

Committee members will email Clare any ideas (Becky will share her newsletter with Clare). 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### Minutes for October 25, 2021

I. ELP approved. It was decided that a meeting will be held this week with Monique to facilitate the incorporation of the pre and post tests ( for ELP data collection) jnto EdGen.

- II. Salt Watch Civic Action project. Discussed the timeline for rolling out the project in high school advisory. Emily and Clare are collaborating with this.
- III. Environmental Professional Development Day March 18th.
   David Grack from Jeffers Foundation will provide a 3 hour workshop.
   We discussed the goal of the workshop, which is to introduce teachers to ways to include environmental education in their content areas, as well as for coaches to incorporate into their discussion with students. Teachers will break out into their Q-comp groups during the workshop.

### **IV.** Nature Journaling:

Nature journaling will be a requirement for next year. [There will still be an environmental civic project required as well.] It was decided that this nature journaling requirement will be in Advisory, rather than each teacher trying to put it into their classes. Coaches will grade the nature journal entries. Each assignment will have a rubric on how to grade that particular nature journal entry.

The teachers of each content area will customize a nature journal entry (or perhaps 2 per content area for 8 months of assignments) and the grading rubric for each of the once-a-month assignments (next year). The next few EE committee meetings will address the ways to format online nature journaling, and everyone is encouraged to bring their resources and ideas to the next meetings. We would like to have this decided by the March workshop so that teachers can break out into their groups to begin working on their nature journaling assignments/rubrics.

We decided that we will not accept the free nature journals from Jeffers Foundation because the mailing is costly. Emily raised the point that handwritten sketches and notes are very important for hand/brain connections, and that students can use their own paper and keep their work in a drive folder of pictures of their work, which could be taken with them when they graduate. Becky shared how she customizes nature journaling on ipads using ClassKick. Scott shared that giving students freedom on how they want to share has been helpful for his past experiences with nature journaling. Mitch said coaches would need rubrics.

- V. Collaboration with seat-based-- Mitch will check on Kysa's progress with WebCam.
  Clare will get to the school forest to begin incorporating it into her class, and Mitch offered to help.
- VI. Field trips- none for middle school yet, but in the process of planning.
